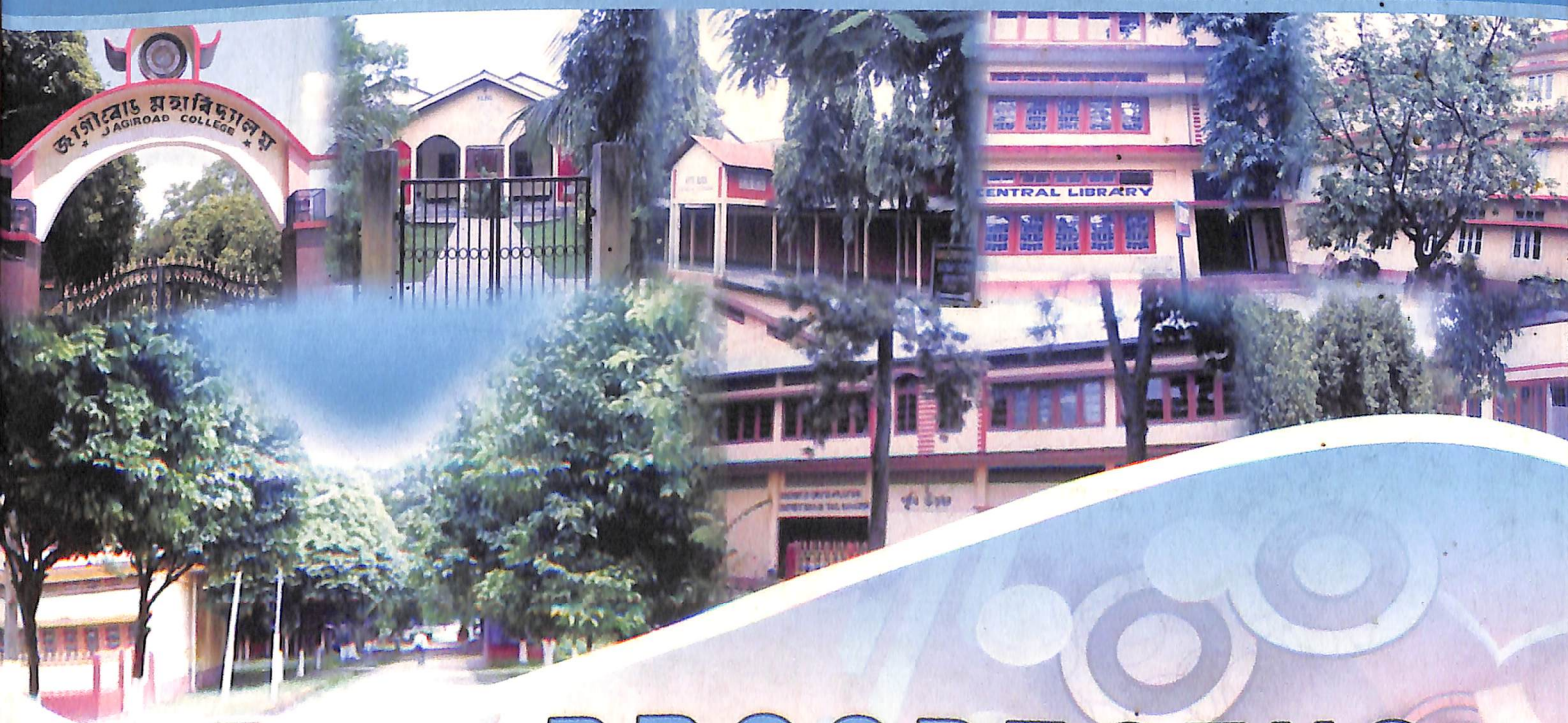

1. Jagiroad College : A brief Profile

Established on 8th August, 1979, the Jagiroad College has already crossed three decades of its glorious existence. A Provincialized College, accredited by the NAAC, it administers all its works under specific rules and norms of the State Government and the Gauhati University and under the provisos of the 2(f) and 12(b) of the UGC.

Situated in a picturesque locale beside the Sonaikuchi Hill Reserved Forest at Jagiroad in the Morigaon District, it has been able to carve a niche for itself in the realms of higher education of the state, thanks to its relentless continuous efforts for excellence in all respects.

The college was conceptualized by a section of foresighted social leaders, who felt the growing aspiration of the public in and around the locality and today the institution has come to be recognized as a prominent institution of higher education in the entire middle Assam.

The Institution is spread over an area of 25 bighas at a prime location in proximity of Guwahati on the N.H.37.

A seat of professionalism, transparency and commitment, the College features a wide-range of programmes with adequate academic flexibility, a system of drawing feedback from all students on initiation, review and redesign programmes if and when necessary, thrusts on effective teaching - learning programmes, a well-conceived plan for monitoring students' progress continuously, a reliable and valid students assessment mechanism, provisions for easy dissemination of information to students about admission, eligibility aspects for all programmes, fee-structure, financial aid etc. and promotion of healthy practices in all matters.

The College currently runs two full-fledged streams: Humanities (Arts) and Science and is also going to open the Commerce Stream, towards which preparations are going afoot. The College also conducts Post Graduate Courses in Tourism and Travel Management (TTM) and Computer Applications, besides its usual undergraduate programmes.

The Institute can boast of having a band of bright and excellent teachers motivated to their august responsibilities with an established record of independent high quality research. A number of them have exposure to both National and International Academic seminars and conferences. Besides, in 1992, the College came to the national limelight as Ms. Moloya Goswami - one of the faculty members bagged the Best Actress Award in National Film Awards for her stellar role in Jahnu Barua directed movie: 'Firingoti'.

Over the decades, the College has made spectacular progress in terms of infrastructure facilities. Simultaneously with that, the authority has also been giving importance upon opening of a number of new programmes and courses. The College campus has separate residential facilities for the Girls and Boys. It has a green premise and rather an Ashram-like ambience. A three-storied Girls' Hostel, a Boys' Hostel, a Computer Centre, a two storied Central Library, a Gymnasium, a Cafeteria, an Auditorium, a Community Service Hall, a sophisticated Teachers' Common Room, Common Rooms for Girls' and Boys' are some of the features of the campus, while upcoming facilities include a Museum on local ethnic cultural properties, an Indoor-stadium and a lounge for Internet surfing for both students and teachers.

In November, 2004, the College received its first accreditation status from the NAAC.

Under IGNOU-NE, a study centre has also been established in the College as part of its Convergence Programmes, which too is delivering its yeoman's service to the cause of expansion of higher education in and around the locality.

Majority of the student of the college belong to the socio-economically disadvantaged community and the College under the present Principal Dr. Bhaben Ch. Neog has been looking up for making a big leap forward by fulfilling all their urges and aspirations through reinforcement of its aims to inculcate a unique value-based and result-oriented learner-centric approach in all its plans and programmes.

b) Professional /Post Graduate (Self-Financing) Courses:

1. The MASTER OF TOURISM MANAGEMENT(M.T.M) Courses

Jagiroad College marks its beginning in Post-Graduate Studies by launching MASTER OF TOURISM MANAGEMENT (MTM) Course under Gauhati University from the session 2005-06. The primary objective of the course is to prepare a cadre of well informed, pro-active and high caliber professionals to be unleashed on the mushrooming, multi-dimensional Tourism Industry.

The course comprises of 32 papers to be completed in 4 (four) Semester in 2 (two) years giving emphasis of Management, Marketing, Travel Agency and Air Lines Ticketing, Financial Management, Hotel operation, Event Management, Entrepreneurship along with other functional areas.

The academic performance of a student would be continuously evaluated through a set of formal and informal methods involving tests such as Group/case discussion, class presentation, seminars, etc.

While undergoing the course, students would have to immerse themselves in the course whole heartedly. Eminent guest faculty drawn from various sections of the tourism industry and other profession would further enhance and balance the quality components in teaching-learning.

The important features of the course are:

- On the Job Training (15 Days in Govt. / Pvt. Sector organization),
- Field Visit / Excursion
- Project Preparation / Dissertation (in each semester).

Eligibility & Admission Process :

The Admission is open for graduates in any stream with a minimum of 40% marks in aggregate. The Admission to the MTM course is purely on the basis of Merit. The reservation of the seats is maintained on the basis of the Government rules and regulations. Written Test/Personal Interview will be organized depending upon the number of applicants.

2. The Post Graduate Diploma in Computer Applications (PGDCA) Course :

Jagiroad College is the precursor in the introduction of Computer Courses at undergraduate level under Gauhati University with its introduction of the Vocational courses in Computer Applications from the year 1996. Since then the College has been trying to excel in producing quality computer professionals suitable for the job market of the corporate world. Due to the latest demand of Computer Professionals in the modern era of Computerization and also the changing environment and rapid advances in Computer Technology in the corporate world, time has made it imperative to introduce more specialized courses.

With two well-equipped fully air-conditioned Computer Laboratories having all facilities and competent faculties, Jagiroad College marks its grand beginning in Post-Graduate Studies by launching **Post Graduate Diploma in Computer Applications (PGDCA)** Courses at the Post Graduate Level from the session 2005-06 to fulfill the demand of the students in the region.

The primary objectives of the course are to produce pro-active well-trained Computer Professionals for the academic as well as corporate world.

The course comprises of 8(eight) papers with an additional project work to be completed in 2(two) semesters in 1(one) year. While undergoing the courses, students will require to do some project works, which will build a sense of self-confidence in them and would help in shaping their future career as Computer Professionals.

Eligibility & Admission Process :

The admission is open for graduates in any stream with a minimum of 40% marks in aggregate. Preference will be given to those students having Mathematics at the Higher Secondary level. The students appearing for their final year in under graduate examination can also apply. However, such candidates, if admitted, will have to produce testimonials regarding their fulfilling the eligibility criteria before the academic session starts, failing which their admission will be cancelled.

Candidates seeking admission to PGDCA course is required to appear in an interview which will be conducted by the college itself.

Salient Features of IGNOU Programmes :

- i. Admission fee is very nominal.
- ii. Attendance in Classes (except Practical Classes) is not mandatory.
- iii. Submission of Assignments to the Study Centre is compulsory which carries 30% weightage.
- iv. Term-End/Final Examination held twice (June & Dec.) one can sit either in June or December.
- v. Admission is open for all interested persons without any bar of Age.
- vi. Open can appear for Examination in any of the Examination Centers throughout India.
- vii. Admission takes place round the year.
- viii. Medium of study is English / Hindi.

ii) IDOL Courses :

Introduction of B.A./B.Com(General) course in distance mode (under IDOL)

Gauhati University has introduced a new scheme of studies for the general courses students for the students studying in affiliated Colleges under G.U. through distance mode from the academic session 2012-13. The rules are as follows:

- i) Students can pursue B.Com. and B.A. (general courses) with MIL(Assamese, Bodo, Nepali, Alt. English), English, Political Science, Education, Philosophy, Economics and History under distance mode.
- ii) The syllabus and the curriculum for the distance mode courses will be the same as those for the regular courses of G.U.
- iii) G.U. affiliated Colleges and IDOL study centres (affiliated to other university) will be eligible to conduct the courses.

Under the scheme students are allowed to pursue maximum two courses (subjects) of his/her choice under distance mode through the college in which he/she was enrolled with but could not accommodate him/her in the regular classes of that course (subject).

The students who offered courses (subject) through distance mode under the scheme got equal credit (at par with the regular courses) for those courses (subjects) passed/cleared under this scheme through distance mode in their first semester examinations.

- a) Students will appear for the end semester examination for those courses offered under IDOL along with the regular candidates in their respective colleges. Question paper and syllabus will be the same as those for the regular courses.
- b) Gauhati University affiliated colleges and IDOL study centers (affiliated other Universities) will enroll students at the beginning of each semester along with other regular students in the prescribed application form provided by IDOL.
- c) Concerned college/study centre will send the list of the students offering courses through distance mode to the Director, IDOL along with the application and prescribed fees. The IDOL shall supply learning materials after receipt of the admission details along with fees.
- d) The total courses fees (study materials, counseling and assignment) for the BA General Course shall be Rs. 2000/- & B.Com Rs. 2500/- per annum excluding the examinations fees.
- e) Students offering courses/subjects through distance mode shall be required to Submit one/two home assignments during the semester as a part of their internal evaluation in lieu of the internal examination, seminars required for the regular courses.
- f) The examination forms for appearing in the semester examinations shall be sent to the Controller of Examinations, Gauhati University as per schedule notified by him,

d) Career Oriented add-on courses:

The UGC has approved the introduction of three innovative and uniquely designed certificate and diploma courses on Functional English, Translation Proficiency and Early Child Care & Education. Any degree level student can pursue one of these programme simultaneously with their B.A./B. Sc. Programmes. Besides all these, the College also proposes to begin short term courses in Computer Applications, Personality Development, Spoken English.

e) Vocational Courses and Programmes:

The College is successfully running Computer Applications and Travel and Tourism Management (TTM) as subsidiary subjects at under graduate level.

3. Admission Procedure

Students can apply for admission into College in prescribed admission form with their own handwriting issued by the College Office on payment of Rs. 100/- and Rs. 20/- (for Renewal Admission) and submit the form within the last date. Admission into the College is strictly on the basis of merit and is governed by College Admission rules. The decision of the College authority would be the final in this regard. For any wrong or misleading information given in the form, the admission will be liable to be cancelled.

Students seeking admission must submit attested copies of the following documents and are required to produce the original documents at the time of admission.

- a) Mark-sheet and Certificates of previous qualifying examinations.
- b) Character Certificate from the Head of the Institution last attended.
- c) Age -proof Certificate (Admit Card showing Date of Birth)
- d) Registration and Migration Certificate in Original (wherever applicable)
- e) Cast Certificate (wherever applicable)
- f) Income Certificate (May be collected from Mouzader/Circle Officer - necessary for Scholarship)

Students who have discontinued their studies after passing the qualifying examination will have to produce a "**Gap Certificate**" issued by the Head of the Institution last attended. The certificate has to mention the activities of the student during the period of gap.

- g) Student detained at the Test Examination of H.S. and T.D.C. classes may be re-admitted to the respective classes as regular student subject to the approval of the Principal.
- h) Unsuccessful candidates of H.S. and T.D.C. final examination shall have to enroll as 'Casual' Students. Such candidates must appear in the test examination of the next year.

4. Infrastructure & Facilities

Classroom Blocks and Buildings : Jagiroad College offers adequate and updated infrastructure for all internal stakeholders. The college houses two beautiful classroom blocks for students of Arts stream. They are suitably christened as the Kalang and the Kapili Blocks after the two perennially flowing tributaries of the Brahmaputra. The Killing Block houses the distinctively updated laboratories, class-rooms and departmental common rooms for Teachers of the Science Stream. The Mayang Block houses the IGNOU Study Centre and some class rooms. Dr. Subhas Saha Memorial Block has the departmental common rooms for Teachers of the Arts Stream and also having a Guest Room of the College.

The Central Library : The three storied Central Library houses a spacious reading hall and reading rooms for teachers and Major Course students. It has a rich collection of 18 thousand volumes of books, journals and magazines, CDs etc. Computerizations of its services are being under way. The expansion of the Library has provided ample space for gradation up and modernization. The two modern departments viz, Computer Department and Tourism and Travel management Department are here in the first and the second floor respectively.

Computer Centre : The College has a sophisticated air-conditioned Computer Centre facilitated by 30 computers for running the PGDCA, Degree level vocational course and H.S. students other short term programmes during vacations. A rapid expansion under the Buniyad scheme of government of Assam has augmented further modernization of the Computer Centre with a provision of 50 more computers.

Cultural Museum : A unique Cultural Museum has been developed by the teachers of the college and it is located in the expanded section of the Central Library. A new Museum Building is under construction in front of the Central Library.

Departmental Libraries : Every department of study of the College has an individual library of its own. Books are issued to both teachers and students i.e. specially of Major Courses and reference books.

Conference Room : The Conference-cum-Seminar room of the college holds its own importance as an active centre for holding brainstorming sessions among the staff and the students.

Auditorium : A sprawling 8000 sq. ft. auditorium has come up for smooth organization of events and activities throughout the session.

Hostels : The College is having both Boys' and Girls Hostel accommodations with limited seats. The Swapna Majhika triple storied Girls' Hostel with an intake capacity of 80 offers excellent facilities of easy and comfortable stay. The Zoon Beel R.C.C. Boys' Hostel with an intake capacity of 40 students also provides a conducive environment for academic pursuits of its inmates.

Gymnasium : The College has a sixteen station multi-gymnasium near the college auditorium. It also houses the yoga centre of the college.

Cafeteria : The college authority has set up a good Cafeteria that offers its services to the students and staff of the College.

Non-Resident Students' Centre : A non-resident students' centre has already come up along with the auditorium. It caters to the diverse recreational needs of the non resident students.

Community Hall : A sprawling Community Hall has come up inside the premises with active collaboration and assistance from the H.D.F.C. and R.G.V.N. It is equipped with traditional handlooms for the use of girl students.

Parking Sheds : The College provides a bi-cycle cum scooter stand for students and the staff. A separate four-wheeler parking slot has also been carved out.

Open air Sitting Places : The College offers an easy and serene open air tree-covered sitting space for students inside its premises. A lush green lawn is also being prepared for holding open air sessions. The Annual Debate among the contestants of JCSU office bearers is an attractive event held every year in the grass carpeted lawn.

5. Societies/Cells/Activities

To ensure participation by students in important community and national service schemes and activities, to motivate and activate them into various co-curricular activities and to build up a productive mechanism towards effective internal governance, there are various on-campus Societies and other bodies.

Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC)

In the year 1994, the University Grants Commission (UGC) has established the National Assessment and Accreditation (NAAC) to monitor the standard of Higher Educational Institution (HEIs). The NAAC has been instilling a momentum of quality consciousness amongst HEIs in India aiming for continuous improvement. The prime agenda of NAAC is to Assess and Accreditate HEIs with an objective of helping them to improve the quality education. Assessment is a performance evaluation process of an institution based on self using certain pre-defined criteria. For this all stakeholders have to be fully engaged in the process of quality assurance of that institution. The main idea of formation of IQAC in an institution is to establish its own internal mechanisms for sustenance, assurance and enhancement of quality culture of education. The UGC has also recognized this initiative of NAAC and it has taken a policy decision to direct all CELLS to establish IQAC.

As a post-accreditation process, the Jagiroad College has also established its Internal Quality Assurance Cell. The IQAC of the college has proactively engaged in various activities simultaneously to help the authority to offer a better quality and favorable atmosphere to its students.

Grievances Redressal Cell

Career Counseling Cell

The College has a Career Counseling Cell to provide guidance and impart training to build the future career of the students. Placement services have also been started under this banner.

Extension Education Cell :

The College has been playing a pro-active role in the extension activities in the greater Jagiroad area in close co-ordination with the NBIRT (Jagiroad College unit). Both of us arranged many successful activities in the field of self employment, employment generation scheme amongst the Youth, Women and also farmers through various activities like Mobile Phone Repairing, T.V. & Radio repairing, Diesel pump set repairing, Motor-cycle repairing, Mushroom cultivation, Milk Production enhancing etc. As a result many of them came out as successful entrepreneur by making them self employed.

N.C.C:

The Jagiroad College NCC Unit is an active cadets' Unit of both boys and girls with an intake of 75 cadets under 8 Assam Battalion NCC, Nagaon, Assam. The Cadets participate in Annual Training Camp, Army Attachment Camp, Combined Annual Training Camp, National Integration Camp, Thal Sainik Camp, Republic Day, Independence Day camp etc quite regularly. Further, there are provisions of various awards and scholarships for successful cadets. Some of the cadets already got Sahara Scholarship, Best Cadet award in Republic Day in New Delhi and more than 100 cadets passed NCC B certificate and 42 Cadets passes NCC C Certificate examinations with good grade.

N.S.S.:

Set up under the Gauhati University, the college N.S.S. unit has been organizing programmes on themes like 'Clean your Locality', 'Green your Locality', 'Clean your Campus', 'Green your Campus', besides holding of awareness programmes on topics of various public. Additional Instruction

A – 1st and 2nd Semester.

1. English is compulsory for students of BA/B.Sc. (Major/General Course). But, students having Major in English will have to take a different English paper in lieu of this English Paper.
2. MIL/Alt.Eng. is compulsory for students of BA with General and Major Course.
3. There is no MIL/Alt.Eng. for B.Sc. students.
4. For BA Major/General Course, a student shall have to choose two subjects (at least one subject must be Non-Language) in addition to MIL/Alt.Eng. Out of two, one subject may be taken as Major subject. Then other subject will be considered as 1st subsidiary subject and MIL/Alt.Eng. is taken as 2nd subsidiary subject. Again, in case of General Course, the two subjects (other than MIL/Alt.Eng.) will be considered as 1st Elective and 2nd Elective subject.
5. In case of MIL/Alt.Eng. (2nd subsidiary subject) for BA Course,
 - a) Student with Language Major will take a Non-Language or Language subject other than the subject he/she is majoring. For example, English Major will take other than Alt.Eng./ Elective English and Assamese Major will take other than Assamese.
6. Students offering Major Course in B.Sc. will have to offer other two Elective (subsidiary) subjects.
7. Students offering General Course in B.Sc. will have to offer three Elective (subsidiary) subjects.

B – 3rd and 4th Semester (B.Sc.)

For 3rd and 4th Semester of B.Sc. Course (General), a student will have to offer three Elective (subsidiary) subjects (with or without practical) each of which carries 100 marks. Environment Studies is a compulsory subject In this case.

C – 5th and 6th Semester (B.Sc.)

For 5th and 6th Semester of B.Sc. Course (General), a student will have to offer two Elective (subsidiary) subjects (with or without practical).

8. Additional Information

SUBMISSION OF MIGRATION CERTIFICATE

Candidates who have passed their last examination from a Board or University other than SEBA, AHESC or G.U. will be required to submit their migration certificate in original at the time of admission or latest by 15th July/2012. Failing to do so may result in admission being cancelled without any notice to them. Migration is usually allowed from Jagiroad College only from 2nd or 3rd year of undergoing a programme.

COLLEGE UNIFORM

Uniform is compulsory to every students while coming to the College.

Uniform for Boys : Cream Coloured Shirt and Steel Grey Pant.

Uniform for Girls : Cream Coloured Mekhela Chadar with Grey bordered or Cream Coloured both Churidaar and Kurta and Grey Churni.

ATTENDANCE

It is obligatory to attend classes regularly and punctually. Willful absence from the classroom lectures will be treated as a serious breach of college discipline. **As per Govt. Rule each student is required to attend in each subject a minimum of 75% of the total lectures delivered in the academic session, failing which he/she shall be debarred from appearing in the Final Examination.**

Attendance of student will be checked monthly by all department Heads and the names of the student having poor attendance will be struck out from the Register. Penalty for lower percentage fixed by the college authority may be charged from students.

EVALUATION AND ASSESSMENT

All students must sit for unit tests, terminals, test examinations, sessional examinations and finish their assignments, projects and field reports within the stipulated period. Marks awarded in these tests form a part of the internal assessment at the end of the academic year and are forwarded to the University before the final examination. **For TDC semester Students Sessional Examination is compulsory, without which one can not sit in the final examination.**

SCHOLARSHIP AND AWARDS

- ST, SC, OBC, Minority and National Merit scholarship for such category of students are offered by the Govt. of Assam on submission of application in prescribed forms.
- Awards are offered to meritorious students topping the H.S., and TDC students, from the college authority and Jagiroad College Teachers Unit.
- Best Graduate Award is awarded to the student, judged best for all round activities and performance in the examination.
- Meritorious economically weaker student are supported by finance, books or otherwise. Arrangement for scholarship (both Government and Non-government organization) will be made by the college authority. Study loans for needy students may also be arranged subject to clearance of Bank's formalities.

Few Important Points to be Remembered by Every Student:

- Follow strictly the time schedule, rules and regulations of the institution.
- Undertake regular and intensive study of learning materials and use Library.
- Make optimum use of learning resources and other support services available in the institution.
- Undergraduate students pursuing Semester Courses must sit in the sessional examinations, failing which they will not be allowed to submit documents for their end - semester examination.
- Ragging is strictly prohibited as per the Supreme Court order.
- Use of mobile phone inside the campus is strictly prohibited.
- Any beverage, narcotic items and tobacco item too are prohibited.
- Students must wear college uniform in the interest of maintenance of college decorum.

- Students must attend classes in each subject to a minimum of 75% of the total lectures delivered in one academic session.
