New Education Policy - 2020

Education is primary for attainment of equitable and just society, and promoting national development of any economy. Development of good human capable of rational thought and action, possessing compassion and empathy, courage and resilience, scientific temper and creative imagination with sound ethical values are the main objectives of the new education policy.

Aim of the New Education Policy

- Unique abilities of each student will be recognised, identified and fostered by developing students in both academic and non-academic fields.
- Foundational Literacy and Numeracy to be achieved by Grade 3.
- No hard separations between arts and sciences, between curricular and extra-curricular activities, between vocational and academic streams, etc.
- To encourage logical decision making and innovation among students.
- Promotion of multilingualism and power of language in teaching and learning process.

School Education

Key points:

1. School curriculum and pedagogy have been restructured in a new 5+3+3+4 design.
2. Foundation Stage for children of ages 2-8 years: 3 years of Anganwadi/pre-school + 2 years in primary school in Grades 1-2.
3. Preparatory Stage for children of ages 11- 14 years (Grades 3-5, covering ages 8-11), Middle Stage (Grades 6-8).
4. Secondary Stage of children covering ages 14-18 (Grades 9-12 in two phases, i.e., 9 and 10 in the first and 11 and 12 in the second).
5. The medium of instruction upto Grade 5, but preferably till Grade 8 and beyond, will be the home language/ mother tongue/local language/regional language.
6. Sanskrit will thus be offered at all levels of school and higher education as an important, enriching option



for students, including as an option in the three-language formula.

7. Foreign languages, such as Korean, Japanese, Thai, French, German, Spanish, Portuguese, and Russian, will also be offered at the secondary level for those students who are interested.
8. Importance will be given to Artificial Intelligence, Design Thinking, Holistic Health, Organic Living, Environmental Education, Global Citizenship Education (GCED), etc. at relevant stages to develop these various important skills in students at all levels.
9. School examinations will be held only for Grades 3, 5 and 8 in a formative style to encourage higher order thinking skills, conceptual clarity and critical thinking.
10. Board examinations for Grades 10 and 12 will be continued but redesigned to encourage holistic development.

Higher Education

Key points:

1. The undergraduate degree will be of either 3 or 4-year duration, with multiple exit options within this period.
2. During undergraduate degree program, a certificate will be offered after completing 1 year in a discipline including vocational and professional areas, a diploma after 2 years of study, or a Bachelor's degree after a 3-year programme.
3. An Academic Bank of Credit (ABC) have been introduced which would digitally store the students' academic credits earned from various recognized Higher Educational Institutions HEIs so that the degrees from an HEI can be awarded taking into account credits earned.
4. Pedagogy will have an increased emphasis on communication, discussion, debate, research, and opportunities for cross-disciplinary and interdisciplinary thinking.
5. India will be promoted as a global study destination to restore its role as a Vishwa Guru by providing premium education at affordable costs.
6. The National Scholarship Portal will be expanded to support, foster, and track the progress of students receiving scholarships.

Constitutional, and universal human values of truth (satya), righteous conduct (dharma), peace (shanti), love (prem), nonviolence (ahimsa), scientific temper, citizenship values, and also life-skills; lessons in seva/service and participation in community service programmes will be considered an integral part of a holistic education.

A brief profile of the College



Jagiroad College (the erstwhile Kapili Anchalik Mahavidyalaya) was established on 8th August, 1979. The College is located at Jagiroad in the Morigaon district of Assam, at a distance of nearly one hundred meters from the AH 2. The serene campus, spread over a spacious area of twenty-five bighas of land, is nestled by the picturesque Sonaikuchi Hill. Culturally it lies very close to Na-Khola—the abode of the Prince Regent of the ancient Kingdom of the Tiwas—one of the indigenous tribes of the state endowed with its distinctive traditional heritage. Jagiroad College was established by a group of foresighted and committed social-workers of the region. Shri Mahendra Ahom, the founder Principal played a pivotal role for seventeen years in the development of the College. With his dynamism, the College was able to attract students from the surrounding rural hinterlands who were mostly “first generation” learners belonging to the socio-economically disadvantaged and marginalized communities. Shri Ahom laid the foundation of the academic and infrastructural blue print of the College while inspiring the teachers to promote the cherished values of inclusiveness and equity without losing sight of qualitative parameters. During his tenure both the Arts and Science Streams of the College were brought under the “deficit-grant-in-aid” system of Government of Assam following affiliation of its programmes and courses by the Gauhati University and it became eligible for development grants under sections 2(f) and 12(b) of the UGC Act 1956. In 1997, Sri Ahom left to Nowgong College and on his resignation, Dr. Altafur Rahman joined the College as the second permanent Principal and served for eight years between 2000 and 2008 and then as the President of the G.B. for five years. During Dr. Rahman’s tenure the College was accredited and assessed by the NAAC and career oriented professional programmes like MTM and PGDCA (under Gauhati University), distance education programmes under IGNOU, tie-up with NBIRT for promotion of entrepreneurship were introduced. He also worked towards further expansion of infrastructural facilities like



construction of hostels, expansion of library and computer center. During Dr. Rahman's tenure, the College also celebrated its Silver Jubilee in 2005 with enthusiasm and gaiety with active coordination of a large number of its alumni. That same year the College came under the ambit of the Assam College Employees (Provincialisation) Act, 2005. Besides Dr. Rahman, one of the former Vice Principals- Shri Utpalmoni Phukan also served as the Principal-in-charge in two phases.

Dr. Bhaben Chandra Neog, the present Principal of the College joined as the third permanent Principal of the College in January 2012 and started off his tenure by launching programmes and courses like Bachelor in Commerce (B.Com. with both Major and General Courses). It is under the initiative of Dr. Neog that the college has introduced a few innovative skill and employment-generating programmes with financial support from the University Grants Commission (UGC). These courses are included in two different schemes namely-Community Colleges scheme and Bachelor of Vocation (BVoc) scheme of the UGC. Of these, the Pulp and Paper Technology (PPT) and Fashion Technology were introduced since 2015-16 under the Community College Scheme of UGC. But due to the closure of the Nagaon Paper Mill of HPCL these courses have been discontinued from 2019-20 session.

Under the Bachelor of Vocation (B.Voc.) scheme of UGC, the College has been imparting B.Voc program in (i) Retail Management (RTM) and (ii) Entertainment-Acting (ACT) since 2015-16 academic session and (iii) Tourism and Hospitality Management (THM) program from the Academic Session 2018-19. All these have been running as three years Bachelor Degree Programmes under the Gauhati University. Sector Skill Councils like Media and Entertainment Sector Skill Council (MESCC), Retailers Association Sector Skill Council (RASCI) and Tourism and Hospitality Management Sector Skill Council (THSC) under the National Skill Development Council (NSDC) evaluated the students studying in these Programmes for their skill components. As a part of skill enhancement and employment centric commitments, the college has signed a number of Memorandums of Understandings (MoUs) with different Industry partners and Institutions to empower the students in skill and related activities. Dr. Bhupen Hazarika Regional Govt. Film and Television Institute (DrBH-RGFTI) located at Kahilipara (currently operating from Amingaon) under the Directorate of Tourism, Govt. of Assam extended their support to the students. They have encouraged endeavors in implementing courses to generate skilled human resources for the benefit of society.

The dynamism of the present Principal has been reflected all around with many new additions in terms of academic as well as in infrastructural fronts during the last eleven years of his tenure in the college. Apart from regular courses and skill-based courses, Distance Education courses have also been introduced for the needy students. Those who could not avail their higher educational need have been availing their dreams realized through the study cum exam centers of IGNOU, KKHSOU and GU-IDOL (renamed as GUCDOE





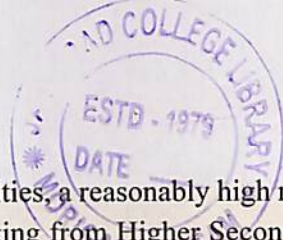
from 2023) located in the college. Since the college puts utmost emphasis upon infrastructural facilities, the process of up-gradation of the classrooms are going on and eight numbers of classrooms have already been upgraded with digital smart-boards. A Digital Language Laboratory was added to the computer department for students seeking improvement of English language skills. A 50 kw Solar power plant was installed in the college to meet the shortage of power supply for the smooth functioning of the academic and other day-to-day activities. The college constructed two new three storied buildings to meet the requirements of its growing needs. Since its early days, Jagiroad College has been in the fore-front in promoting inclusiveness and equity, adopting learner-friendly teaching-learning mechanisms, academic exchanges and organizing seminars, workshops and conferences.

In the past, the college has successfully organized annual/biennial sessions of NEIHA, NEIGS, ACPC, ACTA and AACEA apart from having regular calendar of seminars by the IQAC and hosting State and National level seminars/webinars on different topics/subjects. Dr. Subhash Saha, a faculty of the History department, carved a niche for himself as a multi-faceted scholar-poet-social activist and was engaged in Post Doctoral research till his untimely demise in 1994. Prof. Moloya Goswami, who has retired from her service, bagged the Best Actress Award of the 37th National Film Awards in 1992 for her stellar role in Jahnu Barua directed movie Firingoti (A Spark). She was also thrice nominated as a member of the prestigious jury for the National Film Awards. Shri Tulshi Kr. Bordoloi, a retired faculty of the History Department and a former President of the Tiwa Mathonlai Tokhra (Tiwa Sahitya Sabha) acts as a key resource person regarding studies in the cultural and literary heritage of the Tiwas. Dr. Poban Ch. Gogoi and Dr. Khagen Sarma, both retired Associated Professors and Ex-Heads of Education and Geography Departments respectively contributed their skills in cultural arena for the benefit of the society. Dr. Gogoi established a Music College just in front of the College and Dr. Sarma established a Satriya Sangeet Vidyalaya and helped spread the Vaishnavite culture for the last twenty-five years for the greater cause of the society and common people.

Teachers of the college are also committed and engaged in Major and Minor research projects besides being awarded Ph.D. and M.Phil. Degrees from universities of repute and institutes of national importance. A section of the teachers are also actively engaged in local literary, cultural and sports organizations besides offering assistance and consultancy to community- based organizations. Sections of the non-teaching staff too are sincere and committed in their services.

With its pleasant and peaceful teaching-learning ambience the college campus is an ideal place to study. The College also has a supportive alumni association, many of whom have successfully shaped and carved out their careers in different fields including, education, health, management, society and research areas. Additionally,





the College has excellent infrastructural facilities, a reasonably high rate of gender parity, a wide array of full-time academic programmes and courses ranging from Higher Secondary to Master in Tourism Management, also offers excellent support for affordable and broad-based Distance Education under IGNOU, KKHSOU and IDOL (GUCDOE) of Gauhati University. The College also boasts of a well-stocked and updated library with nearly thirty thousand books, varied schemes of scholarships for learners, seminars and conferences, grievance redressal mechanism, wide range of CCA activities. It is gradually and uniquely poised to scale higher in the contours of Higher Education of Assam. The institution has all along been trying to evolve its own quality-sustenance mechanism in its pursuit to achieve academic excellence. The college has been able to yield B+ grade with 2.71 CGPA in the second cycle of its assessment by NAAC in 2016. Through the DBT Star College Scheme grant received in 2019-20 helped six science departments of the college and facilitates establishment of a common Scientific sophisticated Laboratory, enhancing the science education both theoretically and practically.

NAAC A+ Grade to Jagiroad College 3rd Cycle of NAAC Assessment and Accreditation 2023

The College has been re-assessed and accredited by the NAAC for the 3rd cycle in the year 2023. The Peer Team comprising of Prof. A.S. Gupta, former Pro-Vice Chancellor of Nagaland Central University, Prof. Purushottam Nayak from NEHU, Shillong and Dr. Rajendra Lokhande, Principal, Mahavir Mahavidyalaya, Kolhapur, Maharashtra visited the college on March 9 and 10, 2023. The Peer Team assessed the physical facilities, academic activities, infrastructural developments as well as stakeholders involvement towards holistic development of its learners. The assessment outcome was declared by the NAAC on March 14, 2023. According to the assessment outcome the college was accredited A+ Grade with 3.26 CGPA.

The NAAC assessment outcome encourages the college fraternity to a great extent. As a post assessment initiative, the college is gearing up and working to become an Autonomous Institution very soon. Immediately after the NAAC assessment outcomes, the Education Advisor, Govt. of Assam, Prof. Noni Gopal Mahanta visited the college on April 13, 2023, and encouraged the college fraternity to move for academic Autonomy. Discussions are going on towards this and a special team is constituted and empowered the team to study the pros-and-cons of Autonomous Colleges. Accordingly, the team already visited Nowgong College and invited the Arya Vidyapeeth team led by the Principal Dr. Pradip Bhattacharjee, who visited the college and suggested to proceed for Autonomy. It is the responsibility of the stakeholders of the college to move forward with this dream of Academic Autonomy. Let the expectations grow more.





Jagiroad College - in India's Best College's list:

(In India Today MDRA survey report for five consecutive years: 2019, 2020, 2021, 2022, 2023)

Few vital questions usually arise while considering National Ranking of an Institution. What is the present status of any stream of a higher education institution (HEI) in comparison to the rest of the similar institutions in the state or the country? How an HEI can justify itself as this or that type of Institute or how one can compare its status or rank with other similar institutions? NAAC is an autonomous body for assessment and accreditation of HEIs in every five years. Apart from NAAC, is there any other national ranking agency to annually evaluate or assess any HEI in our country? Although the National Institution Ranking Framework (NIRF) had started the process by working and ranking institutions since 2014-15, parameter wise limited scopes available for stream-wise participation for many institutions. From that perspective, the national survey conducted by the "India Today group" has been conducting Best College Ranking Survey in India (now-a-days known as MDRA-India Today National Best College Ranking Survey) for the last twenty-seven years holds a valid reason to participate. Every year they conduct the survey covering broad aspects in different sections.

We have been participating in their survey since 2019 with a clear intention to check the National status or National Position/Rank among hundreds of other participating institutions. To our surprise and as per the MDRA-India Today National Best Colleges Ranking survey report, in the year 2019, the college had emerged as one of the best colleges in our country. In that year, Jagiroad College ranked nationally at 112, 112 and 141 for its Arts, Science and Commerce streams respectively. Again in 2020, the three streams of the college secured ranks at 127(Arts), 132(Science) and 137(Commerce) in spite of Covid-19 pandemic. In 2020 survey report, the Commerce stream had emerged as 3rd College in India having lowest tuition fee. Further, despite the second wave of Covid-19 pandemic in 2021, the college has yet again established itself as one of the best by holding national ranks at 155(Arts), 149(Science) and 158(Commerce). In 2022 and 2023 also the college could uphold its ranks at national level. Thus, albeit some ups and downs, the college has been maintaining its national ranking ever since its first participation. Thus, the National Ranking to the college that too for five successive years is really a matter of pride for all the fraternity of the college.

"One District One Green Champion" award-2021 to the college

The college proudly announces that under the "Swachhata Action Plan 2020-21" of Ministry of Education GoI, this college was awarded the prestigious "One District One Green Champion" award by the Mahatma Gandhi National Council of Rural Education's recently. In the award list, this college has been enlisted at 24 out of 400 other colleges/ Universities/ NITs/IITs in India. From that perspective, the national survey conducted by the "India Today group" has been conducting Best College Ranking Survey in India (now-a-days known as MDRA-India Today National Best College Ranking Survey) for the last twenty-seven years holds a valid reason to participate. Every year they conduct the survey covering broad aspects in different sections.

We have been participating in their survey since 2019 with a clear intention to check the National status or National Position/Rank among hundreds of other participating institutions. To our surprise and as per the MDRA-India Today National Best Colleges Ranking survey report, in the year 2019, the college had emerged as one of the best colleges in our country. In that year, Jagiroad College ranked nationally at 112, 112 and 141 for its Arts, Science and Commerce streams respectively. Again in 2020, the three streams of the college secured ranks at 127(Arts), 132(Science) and 137(Commerce) in spite of Covid-19 pandemic. In 2020 survey report, the Commerce stream had emerged as 3rd College in India having lowest tuition fee. Further, despite the second wave of Covid-19 pandemic in 2021, the college has yet again established itself as one of the best by holding national ranks at 155(Arts), 149(Science) and 158(Commerce). In 2022 and 2023 also the college could uphold its ranks at national level. Thus, albeit some ups and downs, the college has been maintaining its national ranking ever since its first participation. Thus, the National Ranking to the college that too for five successive years is really a matter of pride for all the fraternity of the college.

"One District One Green Champion" award-2021 to the college

The college proudly announces that under the "Swachhata Action Plan 2020-21" of Ministry of Education GoI, this college was awarded the prestigious "One District One Green Champion" award by the Mahatma Gandhi National Council of Rural Education's recently. In the award list, this college has been enlisted at 24 out of 400 other colleges/ Universities/ NITs/IITs in India. This announcement greatly encourages the college fraternity towards maintaining clean and green environment with social commitments. Thus, the involvement of the college family in areas other than academic gains momentum and expects to be more vigilant and socially conscious institution.



Participation in Unnat Bharat Abhiyan (UBA) activities:

The Unnat Bharat Abhiyan (UBA)2.0 was launched by Govt. of India on 25th April, 2018 in AICTE auditorium, New Delhi. Jagiroad College has participated in that event. Under the UBA, the college has adopted five villages namely Jati Bamphor, No-1 Madhupur, No-1 Bongalbori, Sonaikuchi and Tetelichong. Activities like household survey, cleanliness drive, awareness through school meetings and awareness rally, etc. were conducted in these villages by involving college students (NCC, NSS and others) including faculties. Health check-up camps, street play for awareness distribution of cleaning materials such as bleaching powders, phenyls etc. during flood among affected villagers, blankets and other garments during winter, sensitization of school building prior to reopening of school after Covid lockdown, distribution of face mask in Jati Bamphor village etc. were the other activities conducted by the College under UBA.

PROGRAMMES AND COURSES

Jagiroad College offers the following categories of HS and UG programmes in regular modes

Programme Category-I

Higher Secondary (HS) programmes

(Affiliated to AHSEC)

The College offers two-year HS programmes in Arts, Science and Commerce streams. The Subjects available in the college for HS programme are mentioned below. The curricular framework of the AHSEC is similar to that of the CBSE.

(1) Higher Secondary Arts: (Two years): (Provincialised)

Subjects: English, MIL# (Assamese, Bengali, Hindi, Bodo), Economics, Education, Geography, History, Mathematics*, Computer Science* (with Mathematics only), Political Science and Environmental Studies.

(2) Higher Secondary Science: (Two years): (Provincialised)

Subjects : English, MIL# (Assamese, Bengali, Hindi, Bodo), Biology, Chemistry, Mathematics, Physics, Computer Science* and Environmental Studies.

(3) Higher Secondary Commerce (Two years) (Self-Financed)

Subjects : English, MIL# (Assamese, Bengali, Hindi, Bodo), Accountancy, Business Studies, Finance, Mathematics and Environmental Studies.





Few important points :

- #Note (i):** AHSEC has decided to withdraw the *Alternative English* subject from MIL group from the academic session 2021-22. So, all the students who otherwise wish to take Alternative English as MIL must take any other subject available in the MIL group. Further, one must pass in Environmental Studies subject which is compulsory for HS-1 only.
- Note (ii):** All the students of HS First Year (Arts and Science) are to compulsorily undergo a reading and oral skill test (10 marks) in the subject of English- which is in addition to their theory paper (of 90 marks) on the subject. The total of marks in the subject thus is 100. The Oral test is conducted by the concerned department.
- Note (iii):** Under the guidelines and rules of AHSEC, all HS students (Arts and science) have to take English and MIL/Alt. English as compulsory subjects for first and second years.
- Note (iv):** Environmental Science is compulsory subject for HS First Year (all streams).
- Note (v):** From the rest of the subjects, they must compulsorily choose three Elective Subjects. They may also take up a fourth Elective Subject of their choice.
- Note (vi):** The Annual Examination of HS First Year is conducted by the Examination Committee of the College under the strict guidelines of the AHSEC. The Final Examination is conducted by the AHSEC of which the College is a recognized examination center.
- Note (vii):** *Mathematics subject for Arts stream has been included from the academic session 2020-21.
- Note (viii):** *Computer Science subject for Science and Arts streams has been re-introduced from the academic session 2021-22. For Arts stream students, one can choose Computer Science subject if he/she has chosen Mathematics as one of the subjects.

Programme Category-II

Under Graduate (UG) programmes : FYUGP (Affiliated to Gauhati University)

The College offers Three-Year (six semesters) Major, Minor and Four-Year (eight semesters) Honours with Research Degree under FYUGP programmes. All these programmes are being conducted under the rules and regulations of the Gauhati University. From the academic session 2023-24, GU has introduced NEP 2020 at undergraduate level. The streams and disciplines available in the College under FYUGP are mentioned below.

- Stream Specific :
- 1) Bachelor of Arts (B.A.): (Provincialised)
 - 2) Bachelor of Science (B.Sc.): (Provincialised)
 - 3) Bachelor of Commerce (B.Com.): (Self-financing)
- Discipline Specific:
- 1) Bachelor of Vocation (B.Voc.): (Self-financing)

Subjects offered in the FYUGP programmes are mentioned below. Before going to the programmes offered at this College, one should have some idea about what FYUGP is and how the credits are allotted. They should also have some idea about the core subjects, major, minor, multidisciplinary, value added and ability enhancement courses, skill enhancement courses etc that can be opted for the selected course of study.



A Summary of GU-FYUGP (w.e.f. August 2023)

What is GU-FYUGP?

The Four-Year Undergraduate Programme (FYUGP) at Gauhati University will be implemented in accordance with the UGC's Curriculum Framework and in accordance with the decisions made at the VC's Meeting on November 2022. It is a 4-year degree curriculum under NEP's FYUGP. Three withdrawal options are available from the FYUGP: after one year, after two years, and after three years. After completing the training for a year, students receive a certificate. A diploma is awarded to students who leave after two years. A bachelor's degree is earned if a student graduate after three years. And eventually, after completing all four years, students receive a Bachelor's degree with honours.

When you leave the programme, the doors are still open for you to re-enter it and continue your education from where you left off. However, the programme must be completed with seven years.

Honours and Major

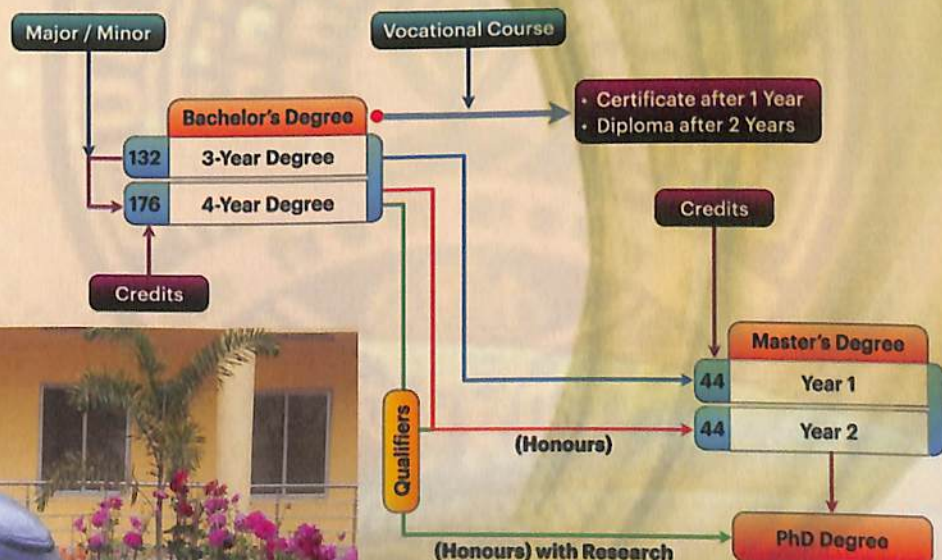
A bachelor's degree with a major can be earned at FYUGP after three years and one with a major and honours after four years.

Progression

A student can apply for admission into the first year of a Master's course, a 2-year degree programme, if they leave the FYUGP after three years. But if a student successfully completes four-year degree with honours under FYUGP, she or he can apply for admission into the second year of a Master's course and only need to finish one year to earn a Master's Degree.

Progression to Doctoral Program

After three years in the Bachelor's course or after completing FYUGP, students who enrol in a Master's programme are eligible to enrol in a doctoral programme leading to PhD. However, if a student is very talented, they may forego the Master's programme and apply for admission directly into a Doctoral programme after completing the FYUGP. The following figure indicates the progression under FYUGP.





How different are the courses?

A student has the option of studying multiple subjects by choosing and switching between them. A course under the FYUGP essentially consists of two components: (a) Core Courses and (b) Common Courses. As the name implies, several core courses are studied by different students, while the common courses are taken by all students. A quick summary of each segment of the programme is provided below.

First Year (Semester I & II)

Three different core subjects are studied in the first year, with one paper assigned for each subject per semester. In addition, one must study a variety of standard subjects that the university has created in accordance with the UGC's Curriculum Framework.

Second Year (Semester III & IV)

Semester III

The third semester is typically spent continuing to study the core subjects that were previously selected in the first year as well as some additional common subjects. By designating one of the basic courses as a Major and the other two as Minors in the third semester, one will also take a step towards studying the subject they are most interested in. Nevertheless, the program's framework will not change from the first and second semesters. Minor subjects can be changed in the third semester with the following limitations:

1. Subject changes are possible as long as the student can participate in them.
2. In addition, the free credits must be used to make up for the new subject as the first-year time was already spent studying a subject that would no longer be continued.

Semester IV

From Semester IV onwards, a student will mainly study the Major subject by taking at least four papers, some of which may be elective depending on the concerned subject. A student who has previously declared a major for the third semester course, still has the option of switching to one of the other two minors in the fourth semester as the new Major provided the subject concerned has vacancy.

Third Year (Semester V & VI)

One will continue to study the Major subject in the third year in order to finish the entire set of 15 Majors papers.



Fourth Year

In order to move to the fourth year, one must devote time to studying advanced courses that are on par with the first Master's degree papers. Additionally, one will have the chance to collaborate on research projects with the college faculty members.

Besides the above, there are some more unique features of the FYUGP. They are:

Open Core Credits

From fourth to sixth semester, one will have time for 4 optional open core credits per semester, which one can utilize to study either of the Major or two Minors. They can also come handy, if one had changed a Minor subject in between.

Double Major

By the time one has completed 3/4 years of study, a student who is willing to put in a little extra effort can convert one of the Minors into a second Major by taking additional online courses (from a designated source only) relating to the Minors. This is over and above the first Major. One would then possess a bachelor's degree with two majors.

Multiple entries and exits

During the FYUGP a student may leave after any year. A student may graduate with a certificate, diploma, or degree, depending on their exit level.

If a student withdraws from the programme after the first year, provided that they have completed all required courses, they will be able to receive a certificate. Similar to that, if the student is still studying after two years and has completed all of the required courses, they will receive a diploma. He or she will eventually graduate with a bachelor's degree after three years.

However, it should be noted that a student who graduates from the FYUGP after the third year with a bachelor's degree would not be able to reapply for admission to the programme for the fourth year. Instead, she/he must apply for admission to a Master's program's first year. Any student who is enrolled in the FYUGP's third year may continue on to the fourth year. He or she receives either a Bachelor's Degree with Honours or a Bachelor's Degree with Honours and Research after successfully completing the fourth year.

*Every student who wishes to withdraw from the programme before three years have passed through the programme **MUST** finish an additional 4-credit vocational course.*





FYUGP Course Structure

Core Courses

The final degree, diploma, or certificate a student will receive at the end of third (or fourth) year, second year, or first year, respectively is determined by their Core Courses. The mark a student receives on their final exams will also be based on their performance in the Core Courses. For the Core Courses, the minimum credit requirement is 84, or 21 courses (papers) with a credit allocation of 4 for each paper per course. At least three Core subjects must be studied by a student.

For both types of degrees, the Core Courses must be selected from a wide range of available disciplines. The Core Courses for a Bachelor's Degree in a Stream are Major and/or Minors, however there are no Majors and Minors for a Bachelor's Degree in a Discipline.

Majors and Minors

For a Bachelor's degree in a certain stream, a student either selects a Major and Minors from among the options, or just Minors. In any case, by the third year, a student must have finished 21 courses, or 84 credits. A Minor course should have a minimum of 12 credits, whereas a Major course must have a minimum of 60 credits. One major and two minors make up the Core Course for the vast majority of students. However, if a student so chooses, she/he can also simply complete a third Minor utilizing the free credits.

Common Courses

All students must take the common courses, which together have a total credit value of 36 over a three-year period. These courses are further divided into the following five (5) subcategories.

Multidisciplinary Course

These three-credit courses cover five subject areas:

- i. Natural and Physical sciences,
- ii. Mathematics, Statistics, and Computer Applications,
- iii. Library, Information and Media Sciences,
- iv. Commerce and management,
- v. Humanities and Social Sciences.

If a student took a multidisciplinary course in Class XI-XII, they CANNOT pick that subject again. Additionally, the subject of these courses MUST NOT be one of the student's already selected Core Subjects.



Ability Enhancement Courses (AEC)

This is an 8-credit course covering Modern Indian Languages (MIL) and English Usage (Communication). Each student needs to complete two papers of 4-credits each - one from English Usage and other from the group of MIL, especially designed for this purpose. Both these courses are further divided into two 2-credit courses each. The English Communication course is to be completed during Semesters 1-2 and the MIL course is to be completed during Semesters 5-6.

Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC)

These are various skill courses with total credit allocation of 9. All students need to complete three skill courses, each with 3 credits during Semesters 1-3.

Value-added Courses (VAC)

The VAC courses will come from four sub groups - (i) Understanding India, (ii) Environmental Science, (iii) Digital and Technological Solutions, and (iv) Health & Wellness, Yoga Education, Sports, and Fitness. Each student will have to take any three courses, each of 2-credit, from any three groups during Semesters 1, 2, & 4. All together they will have a credit allocation of 6. Here one course from the Environmental Science group is compulsory except if the student takes a core course on Environmental Science courses, each of 2 credits, from any of three groups during Semesters 1,2 and 4.

Internships

Every student is required to do an internship for four credits. Any semester from Semesters 3-6 is appropriate for the internship. Internships won't conflict with other classes because they are designed to be completed during semester breaks.

Fourth Year

Since a student can enrol straight in the second year of a Master's programme after successfully completing the FYUGP, the fourth year of the FYUGP is equivalent to the first year of a Master's course.

A student must complete one required paper on Research Methodology (REM), a 4-credit theoretical paper, in the seventh semester of their fourth year. Advanced Core Courses and a Dissertation will make up the remaining credits.





Degrees and course Structure

Under FYUGP, there are two types of Bachelor's Degree that can be earned by the students after successful completion of the programme- i) Bachelor's Degree in a Stream and ii) Bachelor's Degree in a Discipline.

Degree in Stream (Arts, Science, Commerce and Management)

The three different options which a student can choose to complete a 3-year programme under FYUGP is represented below

- ❖ Degree with Major and Minors: A student can choose one Major subject which consists of 15 courses and two Minors which consists of 6 courses (3 for each Minor) along with common course. The student can also utilize the free credits to study another Minor as well (3 more core courses in another subject).
- ❖ Degree with without Major: A student can study all the three core courses equally over a period of 3-year programme (1 to 6 Semester) along with common course.
- ❖ Degree with double Major: In this option, a student may utilize all the free credits choosing another Minor with total credit of 48 either by offline or online mood (MOOCs with due permission. In this case, the student gets a second Major (or double Major) in that subject, only if the student earns the first Major.

Degree in a Discipline

FYUGP offers 'Degree in Discipline' in a number of subjects including vocational courses.

Bachelor's in Vocation (B. Voc)

Following are the Vocational Subjects, where the degree awarded is Bachelor's Degree in Discipline (Vocation).

1. Entertainment (Acting)
2. Retail Management
3. Tourism and Hospitality Management

Salient Features

It has the same FYUGP structure i.e. Core Courses with a minimum of 84 credits and Common Courses credits of 36 (in a 3-year programme). It has no Majors or Minors. Students study certain pre-defined courses designed for the respective discipline.





Subject Groups

Arts

Three Subject Groups make up this stream: MIL (Modern Indian Languages), Other Language, and Social Science. This stream includes 10 (ten) subjects in total.

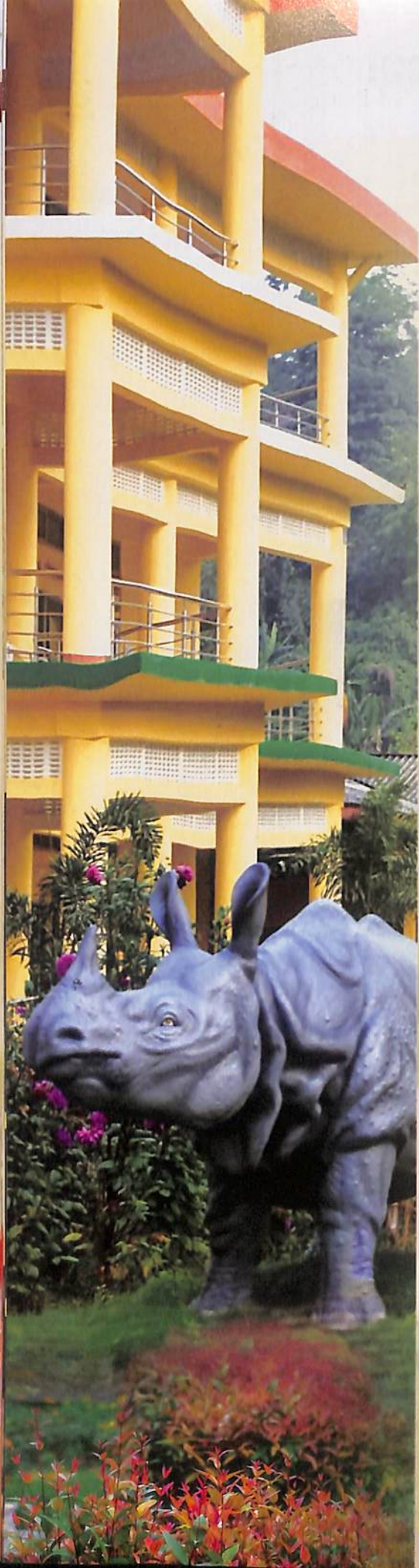

FYUGP Programme details are mentioned below:

Jagiroad College offers two types of Bachelor's Degree programmes under the FYUGP to the students. These are -

1. Bachelor's Degree in stream
2. Bachelor's degree in discipline

Bachelor's Degree in stream will include Arts, Science and Commerce. Students can choose to mix the subjects for the Major and Minors subject to prerequisites and other stipulated requirements and conditions. While Bachelor's degree in discipline will include vocational courses like

- i. Entertainment (Acting) (ACT),
- ii. Retail Management (RTM) and
- iii. Tourism and Hospitality Management (THM)

Course-wise, for both types of degree programmes, the entire FYUGP is split into two categories: (i) Core Courses and (ii) Common Courses. Core courses are different for Arts and Science. However common courses have to be studied by students from Arts, Science and B.Voc. For Commerce, Core Courses and Common Courses are different. 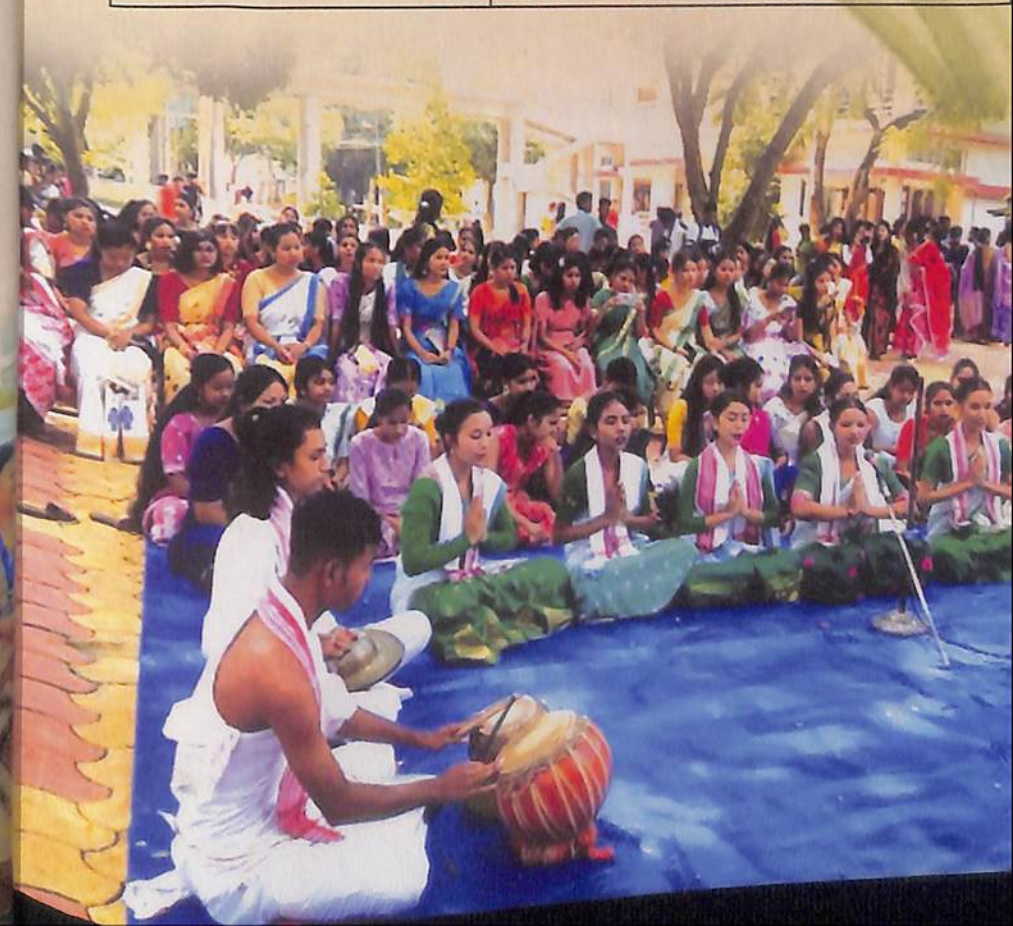

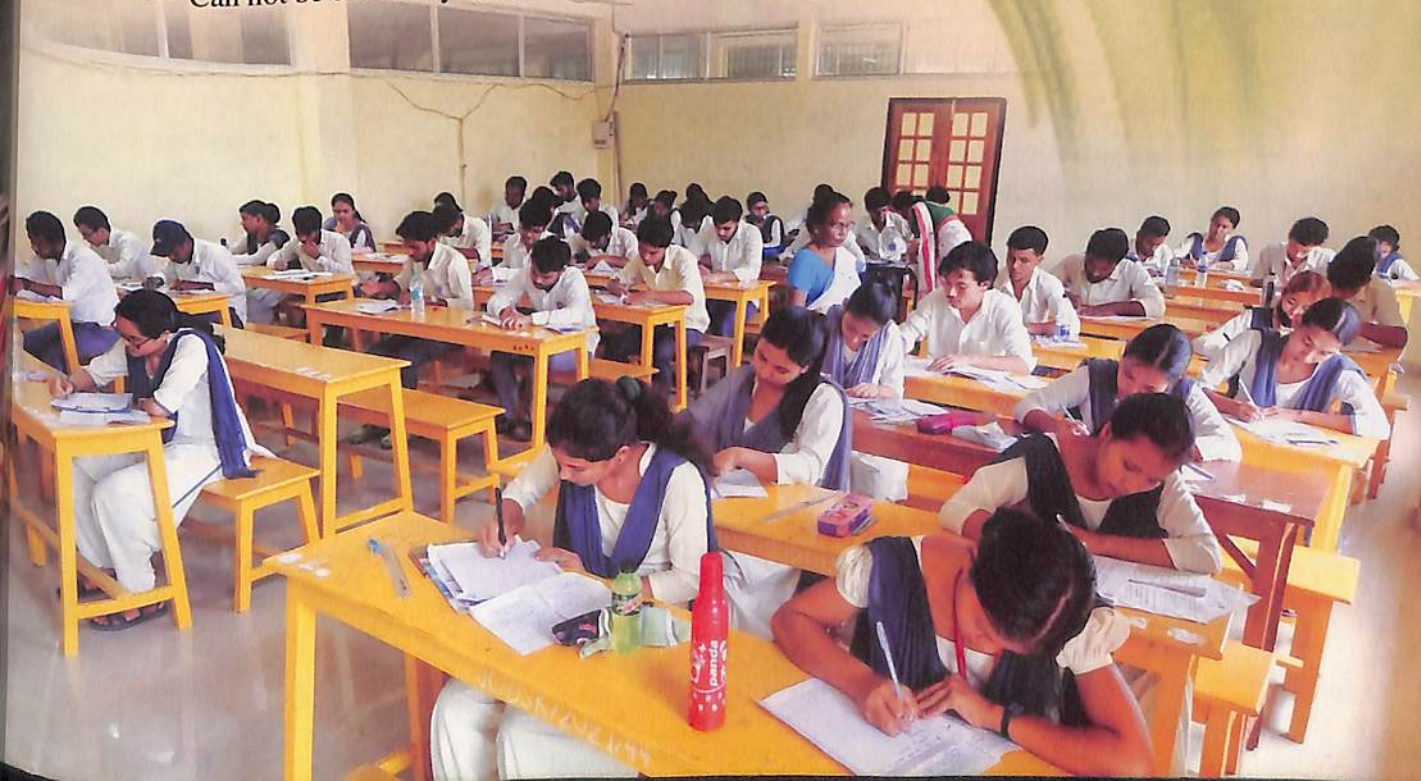

UGC sponsored Three Year (6 Semesters) Vocational Degree Programme

This college has started B.Voc. programmes in three non-conventional subjects under UGC's B.Voc. scheme. Later it is included in NEP-2020 as Bachelor's degree in discipline (B.Voc. Programme).

B.Voc. Programmes are (i) Entertainment (Acting) (ACT), (ii) Retail Management (RTM) and (iii) Tourism and Hospitality Management (THM). All these are skill enhancing, job-market specific and employment/entrepreneurship centric subjects.

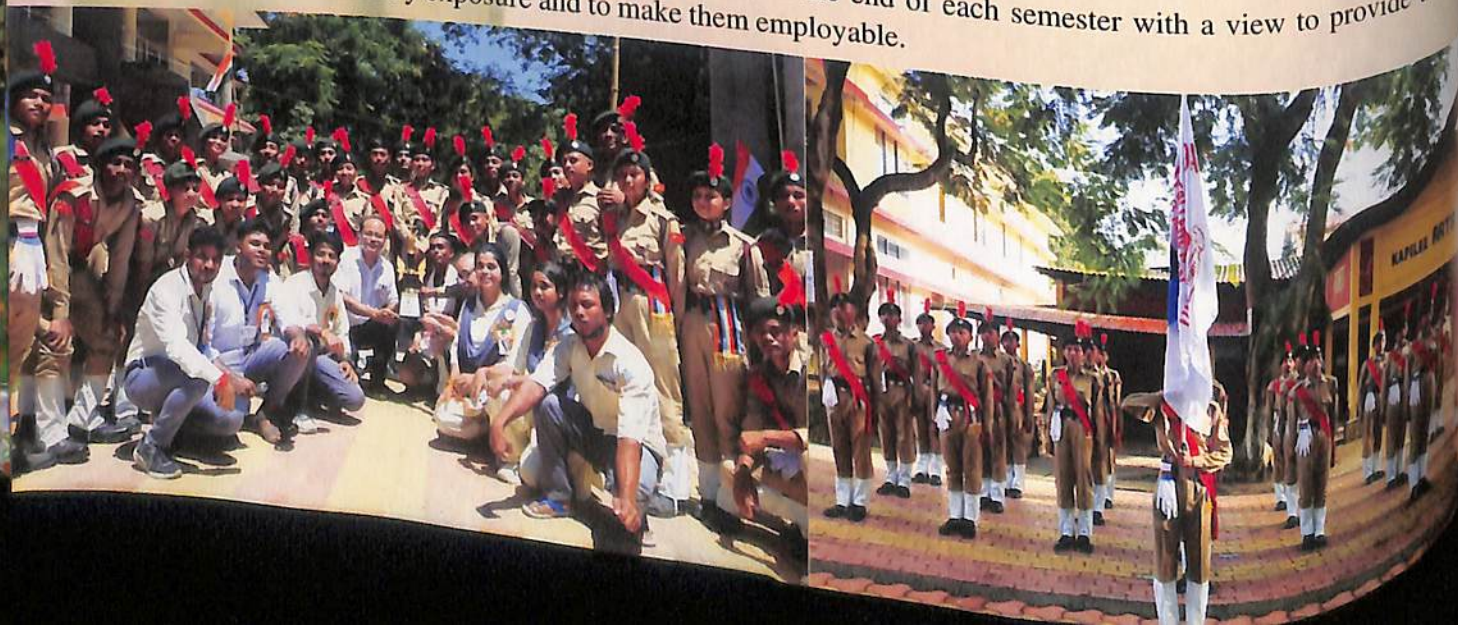
A student of the B.Voc. programme needs to select core and common subjects like Bachelor's degree in Stream. The only difference is that no major is offered in any subject in B. Voc course. The syllabus of the programme is focused on raising employability of graduates and meeting the industry requirements for ready-to-work students through skill development and thereby providing specialization in relevant fields. The B.Voc. programme has the option of multiple exit and entry system in one year, two year, and three year.

1. B.Voc. (Under G.U. in regular mode) degree is equivalent to other degrees like B.A., B.Com. B.Sc. etc.
2. After completion, students will be awarded internationally valid certificates from respective Sector Skill Councils (SSC) i.e. RASCI, MESC and THSC along with the Degree from Gauhati University.

Retail and Media & Entertainment are two of the fastest growing industries in the world. In the North-East India both the sectors are growing as rapidly as anywhere in the world. There is therefore a growing need of skilled personnel and professionals to meet the demand. Tourism Industries are age old system world-wide with ample scope of employment in other related services.

After successful completion of three year B.Voc., Acting students can work in different sectors relating to Media & Entertainment such as films, T.V, theatre, mobile theatre, radio, advertisements, animation etc. as film, television, theatre actors, radio artistes, Voice over artistes, dubbing artistes, production, etc.

At the end of three year B.Voc., Retail Management students will be able to work in different profiles as Team member, Team leader, Cashier, Ware House executive, MIS executive, Store Manager, Floor Manager, Visual Merchandiser, Asstt. Department Manager, Department Manager, etc.

On successful completion of the B.Voc., Tourism and Hospitality Management students can secure jobs as a Front office Manager, Food and Beverage Manager, Resort Manager, Restaurant Manager, Event Supervisor, Airline/Cruise Consultant, Hotel Operation and Entrepreneur etc.

Eligibility Criteria for admission in B.Voc. Programmes

- The eligibility for admission is 10+2 or equivalent, in any streams (Arts/Science/Commerce/Vocation) from any recognized board or university.
- Graduate students of any streams are also eligible for this course.

Bachelor of Vocation in Tourism and Hospitality Management (BVoc-THM) programme focuses on the overall development of the students specially to fit them in the Tourism Industries and Hospitality Sectors with the options of multiple entry and exits at various levels in the courses so that they may join in the industries at any point of time during their studies. The academic program deals with hotel management, hospitality sectors and their allied industries. The main objectives of this program are to enable students to acquire knowledge and skills required by the concerned industries and business sectors. The program is a UGC-sponsored vocational skill enhancing programme and approved by the Tourism & Hospitality Skill Council (THSC). They simultaneously offer skill training as per the National Skills Qualifications Framework (NSQF) under National Skill Development Corporation (NSDC).





Programme Category-III

Post Graduate (Self-financing): Affiliated to Gauhati University

The College has been offering post graduate programmes in one subject : Master in Tourism Management (MTM). The MTM is a two-year (four semesters) Master Degree programme. Students who have completed their graduation or appeared final exam, they can apply to get admission to this programme. It is a professionally effective and employable programme and students who have already passed out from this course have got their employments in various departments/institutes/organizations.

Master of Tourism Management (MTM)

The Northeast India is blessed by nature with abundance of unique natural resources and beauty. It claims itself to be an exotic part of "Incredible India" with all its immense potential for tourism industry. It is a back drop that there is a growing demand for generation of a pool of skilled manpower to cater to need of the tourism industry and its subsidiaries in the region. In view of such a need, the college had launched the aforesaid purely career oriented and professional 2-year post graduate programme since 2005-2006 under the aegis and control of the Gauhati University. The basic objectives of this course of study are to impart training to prepare all with skilled and professional guides in managing the tourism activities.

The aim of this program is to build an eligible student a solid foundation in all facets of the tourism industry. The course curriculum of MTM includes Geography of Tourism, Indian Cultural Heritage, Tourism Industry, Travel Trade Management and others.

The degree that offers specializations in tourism management and other related industries such as hotels, airlines, resorts, event planning, tour companies, travel agencies, airlines etc. During this programme, there is a provision for On Job Training (OJT) in Travel agencies where the students can learn different aspects of regional, national, international tourism management and also they can learn the making of Itinerary and the whole ticketing process and learn different foreign languages. It also focuses on personality development, how to manage different tourists and how to provide them with all the essential information of different regions and places. The main aim of this course is to grow-up a learner as an entrepreneur and as persons having competent tourism knowledge through various specialized subjects of tourism.

With a group of committed and young faculties, state of art in factual facilities and logistic support from the college authority, good number of students has enrolled in every year in this MTM programme and completed successfully with improved performances in their past exams.

Besides these, regular unit tests and group discussions and seminars with power point presentation are held on time to time for overall development and improvement of the students.

From this department many of the students got their deserved placements in various organizations like ATDC, ITDC, different hotel chains in the country, Air India's several Travel Agencies. A few of them also get into Institutes of Tourism Management, Colleges and Universities as faculty members and few as entrepreneurs.

The department is equipped with a well-furnished computer lab, hospitality lab with proper projector classroom and a number of practical instruments available for the practical subjects and also course related books and learning materials are available

Interested students need to appear GU entrance test (if GU decided to conduct the same) which will be notified by the University. Admission Fee: Rs. 8500/- per semester. 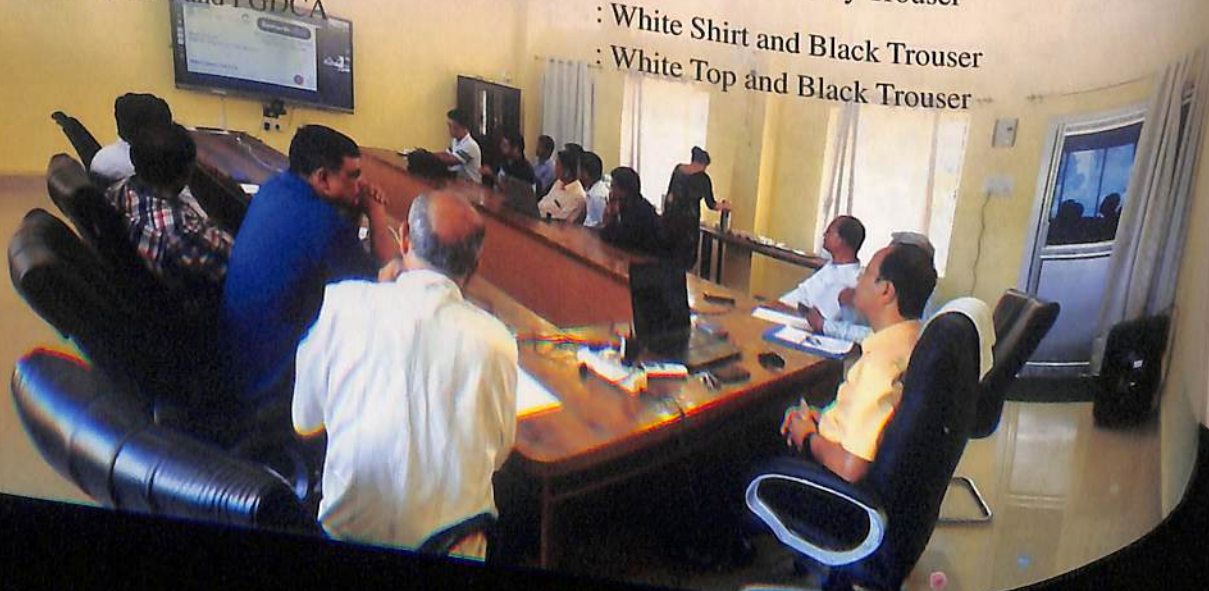

INTERNAL QUALITY ASSURANCE CELL (IQAC)

The internal quality assurance cell (IQAC) is an internal body of a higher educational institution to maintain a quality culture within the college. This cell acts with a plan of action for performance evaluation, assessment and accreditation and quality up-gradation. According to National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC), Bangalore, it is mandatory that all higher educational institutions should have a functional IQAC. Quality enhancement in a college is a continuous process and so, this cell becomes a part of the institution's functioning system and works towards fulfilling the objectives of the institution and achieving the goals. It disseminates its responsibilities through the formations of different cells. With the help of all stakeholders IQAC performs different activities towards teaching-learning and evaluation, skill orientation, career orientation of students. It takes necessary action to expose the students to the modern ICT based knowledge, organizes popular lectures by academicians from advanced institutions, lectures for career guidance, skill learning etc. It encourages innovative changes, encourages different training programmes to build up competence, augments learner centric environment for quality education. Moreover, IQAC also organizes workshops, seminars for academic advancement of the faculty members, stimulates the academic environment for promotion of quality of teaching-learning and research in higher education, undertakes quality-related research studies and initiates faculty exchange programmes. The career guidance and placement cell organizes the career counseling sessions in the campus and takes care of the placement, internship and On-Job Training (OJT) of students. In collaboration with all stakeholders including alumni of the institution, IQAC works for the quality promotion and sustenance. It adapts a system of continuous documentation to create a data base, prepares the Annual Quality Assurance Report (AQAR) of the institution and takes care of its timely submission to NAAC.

Jagiroad College has a functional IQAC with a permanent office room and continuously doing its activities for the all-round development of students and the institution. The earlier IQAC Coordinator Dr. Utpal Rajguru led the IQAC for four years and successfully completed the third cycle of NAAC assessment and accreditation and achieved A+ Grade with 3.26 CGPA. The joint Staff meeting with GB analysed the NAAC assessment outcomes and expressed satisfaction over the final outcome. The meeting entrusted Dr. Chitta Ranjan Sarkar, Associate Professor in Chemistry as the new Coordinator of IQAC w.e.f. 3rd April, 2023.

TEACHING-LEARNING AND EVALUATION:

Jagiroad College has imprinted a role for itself through evolution and continuous up-gradation of its teaching-learning standards by setting and developing its own benchmarks. The fairness, transparency and qualitative edge of its teaching-learning ambience have been sustained through the College's endeavor to recruit teachers having sound academic background, good potential and enthusiasm by the College authority since its inception. The quality of its teachers can be gauged from the relatively young average age of incumbents, diverse socio-economic and cultural backgrounds, wide array of specializations, gender parity, readiness and acceptance of innovative teaching-learning mechanisms, diverse research interests and studies, empathy for students belonging to socio-economically marginalized and disadvantaged communities, promotion of social and cultural harmony, close contact with alumni, community orientation and an urge to accept fresh challenges and transcend boundaries in pedagogic practices and orientations. The NAAC's assessment and accreditation report prominently highlighted this cardinal aspect of Jagiroad College. The experience, knowledge and skills of the teaching staff have together erected a foundation for undertaking experiments and sustained application of the best of the "traditional" and indigenous" teaching-learning mechanism and ICT based newer mechanisms. Jagiroad College has been especially successful in constantly building up a reputation for its transparent, unbiased, fair



and continuous assessment and evaluation mechanisms. It strictly adheres to all the relevant examination rules and regulations of the Assam Higher Secondary Education Council and Gauhati University. The annual examination of Higher Secondary First Year is conducted strictly in accordance with the rules of the AHSEC. Examination evaluation related grievances have been handled carefully in indirect consultation with the university examination branch. All students get a fair deal here in this college during the tenure of studentship.

RESEARCH

The teaching staff of the College are actively engaged in varied research studies in a wide array of areas of Humanities, Social Sciences, Physical Sciences, Mathematics, Biological Sciences under various departments of studies of Gauhati University, Assam University, NEHU, Dibrugarh University and IITG and number of them have already been awarded M.Phil and Ph.D. degrees. A number of teachers are also actively involved in research activities under UGC, ICSSR and DST grants (both minor and major research projects). The College constituted research committee with its experienced faculties to foster the culture of research in the institution.

STUDENTS' SUPPORT AND PROGRESSION

Career Guidance, Counselling and Placement

The counselling of students' have traditionally been a part of teaching-learning mechanism and practices of the College. Most of the teachers offer and are adept in close and intimate counselling on academic and career related matters especially to students enrolled in Honours/ Major Courses and Skill Oriented Programmes. The College has an Information, Career Guidance and Counselling Cell (ICGCC) through which the students have been given guidance at regular intervals. Though the college at present does not have a formal structure of a separate Placement Cell, the ICGCC has in the past organised several placement workshops, interactive sessions with some firms and agencies of both the state and outside it.

PRIME DUTY OF NEW COMERS

Teachers and students are the two main stakeholders in the college. Apart from teaching-learning activities in the classroom they must do many other activities in and around the college for uplifting the status of the institution. INFRASTRUCTURAL AND CCA FACILITIES

Classroom Blocks and Buildings

Jagiroad College offers adequate and updated infrastructure for all internal stakeholders. The College houses nine blocks for students, academic activities including office and library works. These are i) Kapili Block, ii) Kolong Block, iii) Killing Block, iv) Baliram Das Block (BDB), v) Nandalal Upadhyaya Block (NLU), vi) Pabitora Block (PTB), vii) Sonaikuchi block, viii) Library Block and ix) Dr.S.S. Block. Killing block is being renovated under RUSA fund with more classrooms and added facilities. All these block houses faculties are of Arts, Science, Commerce, Vocational and Post Graduate programmes. The Distance Learning Study Centers of three Universities are also located in these blocks. Two well-furnished seminar halls, one studio on performing art (acting), one Sound Recording Studio, Gymnasium Hall, NCC, NSS rooms are accommodated in this campus. A new girl's hostel is added to the existing hostel to improve intake capacity. The College also has laboratory for the Pulp and Paper Technology and Fashion Technology constructed under Community College Scheme. New constructions are also going on to accommodate more and more programmes with all possible modern facilities required for academic activities in near future. A well-furnished canteen is also there in the campus. A foot bridge is also under construction to improve connectivity between newly constructed Kolong block and Digital Library building. Two science laboratories are also under operation in DBT scheme to facilitate practical learning between the science student belonging to physics and biological sciences. A center for Yoga is being run in the digital library building for awarding performing and enhancing Indian traditional culture of yoga for better physical and mental health. A new college gate is being constructed to improve the security of the institution.

The Central Library:

The Central Library houses a spacious reading hall and reading rooms for teachers and Major Course students. It has a rich collection of books including journals and magazines, CDs etc. Books are being regularly purchased on recommendation of the faculty members. Computerizations of its services are well under way. The library has recently undergone some renovation works to ensure a cozy environment for its users. Following necessary renovation works, the Library now provides separate sitting arrangement for the boys and the girls. With sophisticated furnishings, the Library also has provision of a reading room for the faculties, a circulation section and a separate periodical section. Internet Connectivity is provided with 10 numbers of Computers connected through N-Computing and placed just behind the main entrance gate for easy accessibility by the students and other staff. Reprographic facility is also provided in the same location.

Book Bank scheme of the College Library:

The College Library has introduced the Book Bank facility (for H.S. and undergraduate level students) as one of the students' support measures. The Book Bank lends textbooks and reference books to the especially meritorious students and to those coming from the economically backward families. The facility has been further developed with enrichment through donated books from the internal stakeholders of the college (teachers, members of the non-teaching staff and the students). Willing students may contact the Librarian for necessary details.

Computer Centre:

The College has two sophisticated computer Labs (including a computer Center as Language Lab) with 46 computers for running the PGDCA, Degree level Vocational course and other short-term courses for students.

Asprawling 8000sq.ft. auditorium is already there in the college for smooth organization of mass events and activities through out the session.

Hostels:

The Swapna Majika triple storied Girls' Hostel with an intake capacity of 120 offers excellent facilitiesof easy and comfortable stay. The Zoon Beel R.C.C. Boys' Hostel with an intake capacity of 50 students also provides a pleasant and cozy environment for academic pursuits to its inmates.

Purified and cold drinking water:

The college has been providing clean, pure and cold drinking water facilities to all the students and all other internal stake holders.

Uninterrupted Power Supply:

The College has installed a50KW solar power plant from the subsidize dgrants of MNRE Go since 2013 and has been facilitating uninterrupted powersupply throughout the campus.

Digital Class Rooms:

The college authority has introduced digital classrooms with smart boards in six class rooms, two seminar halls and one smart class room at ICT@college lab of the college to facilitate updated and smooth teaching learning mechanism. Students use these smart class rooms to present their seminar presentations as part of the irriculum requirements.

Boys' and Girls' Common Room:

The college has provided spacious separate Boys' and Girls' commonrooms with attached toilets and necessary amenities for Girls Students.

Gymnasium:

The college has a sixteen station multi gymnasium near the college auditorium. The College also has a yoga centre.

Sports Field with Grass running Tracks:

The College has constructed a football field with grass running tracks from the financial support from UGC. After completion of the sports field the college fulfils its dream of having its own field. Earlier the College had to hire sports field from the Jagiroad Sports Authority. Two GU Inter College Sports Tournaments held at this field. The College also facilitates Indian traditional sports like, Kabbadi, Kho-Kho and Due Ball, a comparatively new Indian Game. It is a matter of pride that, as a result of the promotion of this Due Ball with its court at the College campus students could take part in national events twice.

Further, the College has recently completed a world class combined Basketball and Volleyball field just near the main gate. The combined field was constructed with financial assistance of UGC and RUSA. Students regularly practice at this combined Basketball and Volleyball field since the day of inauguration. The field was inaugurated by the hon'ble Minister Sri Piyush Hazarika, who is also the local MLA and an honorable member of the College Governing Body

Canteen:

The college authority has set up a well-furnished canteen that offers its services to the students and staff of the College. Many social and government organizations have been utilizing this canteen for different occasions. These days during lockdown period due to COVID-19, all food items are prepared at this canteen and served the quarantined persons stayed at two of its hostels and in academic blocks.

The College offers a serene open-air tree covered sitting space for students inside its premises. A lush green lawn is also being prepared for holding of open-air sessions. The Annual Debate among the contestants of JCSU office bearers is an attractive event-traditionally held every year in the grass carpeted lawn.



It is once again brought to your kind notice that ragging is a criminal offence and UGC has framed Regulations on curbing the menace of ragging in higher educational institutions in order to prohibit, prevent and eliminate the scourge of ragging. These Regulations are mandatory and all institutions are required to take necessary steps for its implementation in toto including the monitoring mechanisms as per provisions in the above Regulations and ensure its strict compliance.

Any violation of UGC regulations as cited above or if any institution fails to take adequate steps to prevent ragging or does not act in accordance with these Regulations, if fails to punish perpetrators of incidents of ragging suitably, UGC shall call for punitive action against institutions.

All institutions are requested to step up anti-ragging mechanism by way of adequate publicity through various mediums, action-packed anti-ragging committee and anti ragging squad, quick-response system, CCTV cameras at vital points, alarm bells, regular interaction and counseling, identification of trouble-triggers, prominence to anti-ragging in the institution's prospectus and information booklets/brochures surprise inspection of hostels, students accommodation. Canteens, rest cum recreational rooms, toilets, bus-stands and any other measure which would augur well in preventing/quelling ragging and any uncalled for behavior/incident. The students and the parent/guardian community may also be made aware of the anti-ragging helpline, anti-ragging website, anti-ragging monitoring agency and all Universities/Colleges/Institutions should take necessary steps for its implementation under intimation to the UGC.

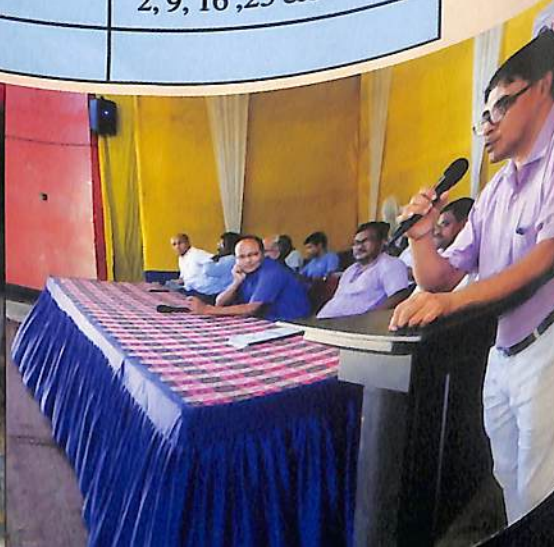

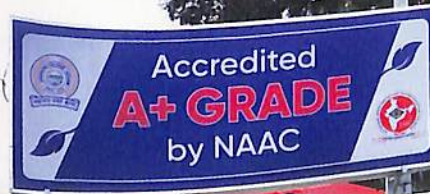

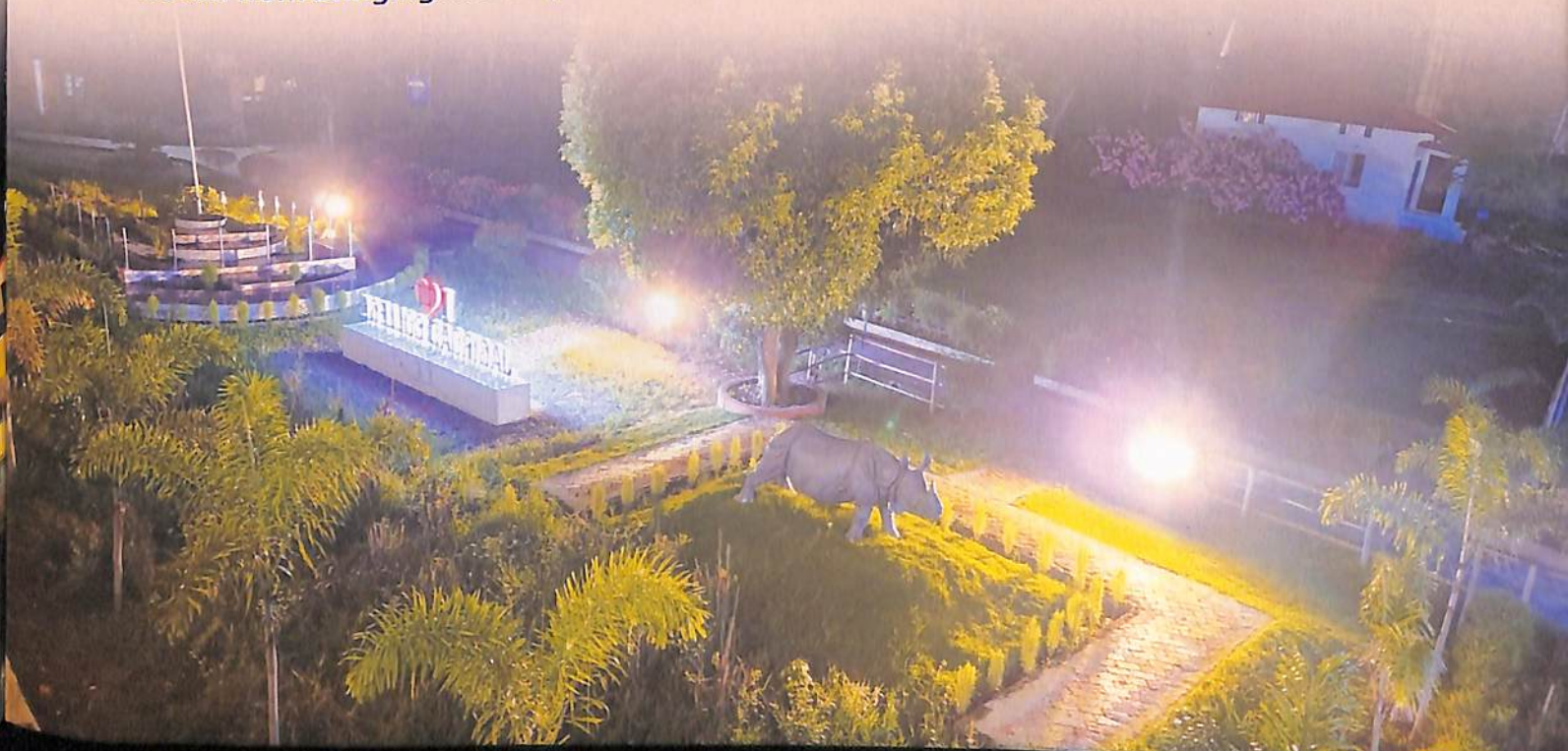
