JAGIROAD COLLEGE : AN INTRODUCTION

JAGIROAD COLLEGE, established in 1979, has been a gradual unfolding of a dream vision — nursed and groomed by a host of social workers ably led by Shri Nandalal Upadhaya. Shri Mahendra Ahom, the Founder Principal, played a pivotal role in shaping the blue print of fast track development of the college. Sheer zeal, enthusiasm and dedication of Shri Ahom acted as the catalytic agents that inspired the 50 odd Lecturers and the students of the college immersing themselves in the endeavour for academic excellence. Starting as a single faculty undergraduate Arts college under the university of Gauhati the college made fast strides with the full-fledged science stream coming up in 1986. Regular classes, good results, periodic evaluation and strict discipline have been the hallmarks of the institution. The Lecturers of the college have been singularly poised and privileged to educate a vibrant and colourful student community - most of them coming from rural areas and a number of them being first generation learners. Prominent educationists of the state and the country have expressed and recorded effusive remarks about the future prospects of the college. Still two years short of its Silver Jubilee, the college has been able to reckon itself among the best colleges of the region. The idyllic setting wrestled by the stunning Sonaikuchi Hills makes the college one of the most beautiful educational premise in the state. The serene, vatika like ambience acts like a soothing balm upon everyone.

College Management

The College is managed by Governing Body constituted by the Govt. of Assam as per provisions of Assam Non Government College Management Rules, 2001.

Aims and Objectives of the college

The aims and objectives of the college are :

- ★ To impart quality higher education in the disciplines of Arts and Science.
- ★ To equip the students with a fresh, strong and liberal vision of life that would enable them to face the challenges of life with greater confidence and poise.
- ★ To inculcate the spirit of inquiry, scientific temper liberal and humanitarian values among the students.
- ★ To serve the society with a vigorous mission through various extension activities.
- ★ To strive for preservation of cultural heritage, the pristine physical environment of the surrounding areas.

Infrastructure and Facilities

The college boasts and offers excellent and updated infrastructure for the students and the staff. The college houses three beautiful blockrooms for the development of Arts education— two of them suitably named after rivers surrounding Jagiroad — the Kapili and the Kalang. The Kiling block houses the sophisticated classrooms and laboratories of the Science stream. Besides Dr. Subhas Saha memorial block provides warm and cosy departmental common rooms for the Lecturers. The students of the college have thus direct and ample opportunities of interacting with the teachers. The facilities for the students can be summed up as below :

The College Library

The double storied Library building houses a spacious reading hall. It boasts of thousands of valuable books among its collections. Journals, magazines and newspapers are also subscribed regularly. A new reference section for Major Course students at the Degree level and the teachers would be coming up soon. It also accommodates the seminar Room and the computer centre of the college. Each student is provided with two nontransferable library cards and is allowed to borrow two books against these cards at a time for fifteen days. A borrower is personally responsible for loss or damage of any book borrowed. Late fine @ Rs. 2/- per day is charged for each book for delay in return. Internet facility is also available in the college.

Hostel Facilities

Two spacious and modern hostels for the girls accommodates students from far flung areas and diverse backgrounds. A new boys hostel is also coming up soon to cater to the needs of the young boys travelling from remote and distant areas. The atmosphere of the hostels are conducive for zealous and dedicated students.

Boys and Girls common rooms

The college authority has plans afoot to provide cosy and comfortable boys and girls common rooms. Ample scope for indoor games and creating activities would also be provided.

Canteen

The College authority has also decided to set up a good canteen for the staff and the students inside the premises of the college.

SPECIAL CENTRES AND COURSES

Jagiroad College has certain distinctive features, plans and programmes for the

students and the community that sets it apart from numerous other colleges. Some of them are highlighted below :

GRADUATION ++

Jagiroad College is planning to introduce unique program of studies named Graduation ++ covering in information technology and applications, foundations in science and technology, Humanities and Social Science, self working skills information, Mathematical skills, statistics and Computer Based tools logical and Analytical Reasoning, Verbal Utility, Management concepts, Global values and Social concerns portfolio Developments under the aegis of centre for Higher Education Studies and Training (CHEST) and Society for education and Economic Development (SEED) of New Delhi. These courses can be pursued by students enrolled in Degree Course in Science Arts & Commerce and Graduates in all the disciplines as well and they are going to open new vistas for them. The courses to say the least, have all been innovatively designed and development to prepare the students for the job market after graduation and to elevate the traditional under graduate courses to the level of Degrees offered by Foreign Universities.

IGNOU Study Centre

The college authority has also plans afoot to open a IGNOU study centre seeing the diverse needs of the students in special and the community in general. It is going to help the students in pursuing highly rated IGNOU diplomas and degrees.

Information and Career Guidance and Counselling Cell

The college is going to have a full-fledged and updated Information and Career guidance and counselling cell from the current academic session. The students would now have direct and easy access to all the relevant and necessary informations regarding their future careers.

Vocational Courses

Two vocational courses in computer applications and Tourism and Travel Management are successfully running at the undergraduate level with assistance from the U.G.C.

Short term courses :

The college also offers innovatively designed short term courses in computer applications Functional English, Personality Development etc. to give them an edge over others.

Community Information Centre :

Students can avail internet facilities in the community Information Centre located inside

the college premises (funded by Govt. of India). The services of the centre would be available for the students as well as for the general public round the clock.

Extension Education Centre

The Extension Education Centre of the college has already started holding training and awareness programmes for the students in special and the community in general in collaboration with State Institute of Rural Development, Indian Institute of Enterprenureship, Centre for Extension Education, Gauhati University, etc. to motivate and help the youth in various modes of self-employment.

SCIENCE : Physics, Chemistry, Mathematics, Botany, Zoology and Geography.

Change of combination of subjects will not be allowed after 31st August, 2002.

Admission Procedure

Students can apply for admission into the College in prescribed admission form with their own handwriting issued by the college office on payment of Rs. 20/-. Admission into the College is strictly on the basis of merit and governed by College Admission rules. The decision of the College authority would be the final decision in this regard. For any wrong or misleading information given in the form, the admission will be liable to be cancelled.

Students those who seek admission are required to produce the following documents at the time of interview.

- a) Original copies of marksheets and certificates of previous qualifying examinations.
- b) Transfer certificate and character certificate from the Head of the Institution last attended.
- c) Age Certificate
- d) Registration or Migration Certificate

Students who passed the qualifying examination earlier than the current year will have to produce a "Gap Certificate" issued by the Head of the Institution last attended.

This certificate has to mention the activities of the student during the period of gap.

Students will have to enclose attested copies of all the certificates, marksheet mentioned in clause (a) along with the application form.

- e) Students detained at the Test and Annual Examination of H. S. and T. D. C. classes may be readmitted to the respective classes as regular students. Readmission in the college by unsuccessful candidate is not a matter of right.
- f) Unsuccessful candidates of H. S. (Sc.) 1st Yr. class will not be readmitted in H. S. 1st Yr. Class. However, they can take admission in H. S. 1st Yr. (Arts) class.
- g) Unsuccessful candidates of H. S. and T. D. C. final examination shall have to get their names enrolled as casual students. They must appear in the test examination of the next year.

Submission of Migration certificate

Candidates who have passed their last examination from a board or university other than SEBA, AHSEC or G. U. will be required to submit their migration certificate in original latest by 1st October, 2002. Failing to do so may result in admission being cancelled without any further notice to them. Migration is usually allowed from Jagiraod College only from 2nd or 3rd year.

Academic Session

The Academic Session for the year begins from the month of June. The programme of the major events of the college during the session is outlined in the academic calendar of the college.

Co-curricular Activities : A note

The college offers an excellent and encouraging ambience for co-curricular activities. Prominent among them are highlighted below :

Cultural Society

The cultural society of the college has a distinguishing record of being the cradle of producing budding artists and have brought laurels to the institute by winning most of the prestigious events of in the Annual Inter college youth Festival held in Gauhati University for consecutive years. Several members of the cultural society have been working in plays, TV serials and films of acclaim. The staff acts as guides in the students cultural activities.

Literary and Debating Society

The literary and debating society of the college is a vibrant society and offers ample scope for facilitating and developing budding talents.

Departmental societies

The geographical society of the college is an active organ for popularizing geographical sciences. Very recently it successfully hosted the Bi-ennial NEIGS conference in the college. The students Union Society : A few words

The Jagiroad college students' Union Society has got certain distinctive features. Elections are held under a fair, transparent, jovial and comradeship among the aspirants. A open debate among the contestants is an attractive and uniquely democratic feature. the JCSU has therefore regularly played an active & collaborative role in furthering the aims and objectives of the institution.

College Uniform

The college uniform is formed of Cream Colour Shirt and Steel Grey Pant for boys. For girls Cream Colour Mekhela Shadar with grey border or grey bordered Suridar Kurta with Grey Churni is permissible.

Attendance

It is obligatory to attend classes regularly and punctually. Wilful absence from the classroom lecturer will be treated as a serious breach of the College discipline. As per Govt. Rule each student is required to attend in each subject a minimum of 75% of the total lectures delivered in the academic session, failing which he/she shall be debarred from appearing in the Final Examination.

Evaluation

Apart from the terminal, test and annual examinations a system of regular assignments/class/unit test has been introduced by the college to assess the academic etc. of the students. Marks awarded in these tests form a part of the internal assessment at the end of the academic year and are forwarded to the university before the final examination.

Scholarship and Awards

- ST/SC and OBC scholarship for such category of students are offered by the Govt. of Assam on submission of proper application in prescribed forms.
- Awards are offered to meritorious students topping the H.S. Sc./Arts TDC Sc./Arts studies, from the college authority and Jagiroad College Teachers Association.
- Best Graduate Award is awarded to the student judged best for all round activities and performance in the examination.

General Rules for Maintenance of Discipline in the College

- i) Great emphasis is laid on discipline and character building and students are required to maintain a high standard of discipline and moral in and around the college campus.
 - ii) College uniform is a must in the classroom and in the college premises. Students are expected to present themselves with good postures and gestures.
 - iii) Students admitted to the college must abide by all rules and regulations as prescribed by the college Authority. Violation of rules, unsatisfactory progress, irregular attendance, irregular payment of college and hostel fees, showing discourtesy to the teachers and staff members in any form, adoption of unfair means during examination etc. are some of the offences which will not be tolerated.
 - iv) Student society and association shall be subjected to such guidance and control as the college administration may prescribe from time to time. Only such societies as have been recognised by the college authority shall have the facilities of the college premises. Any notice desired to be circulated by the students any where in the college and hostel premises must have prior approval of the Principal of the college.
 - v) All powers for maintenance of discipline are vested with the college authority and the decision shall be final and binding in all such matters. Raging is punishable according to ordinance and laws.
 - vi) Students must carry their Identity Cards with them everyday.
