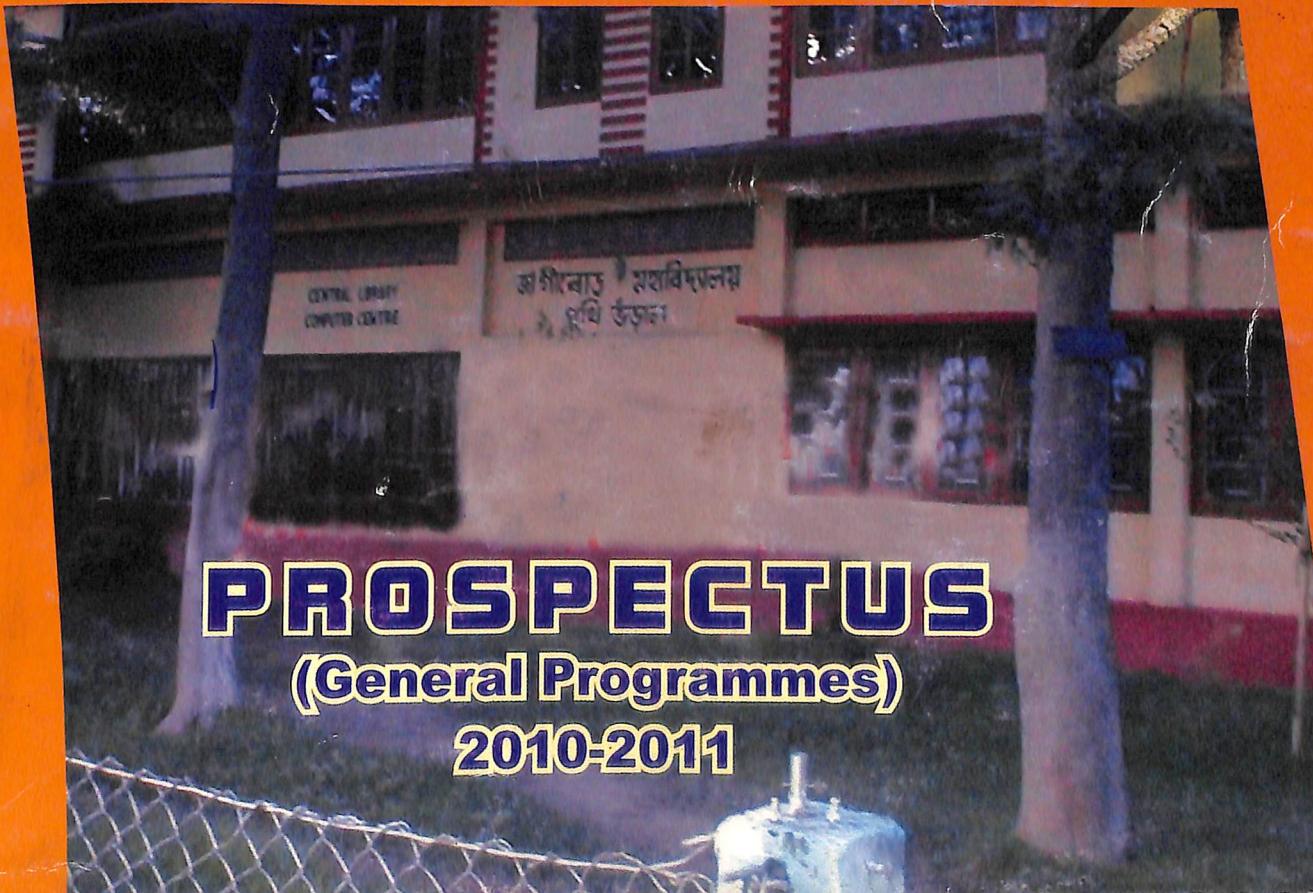


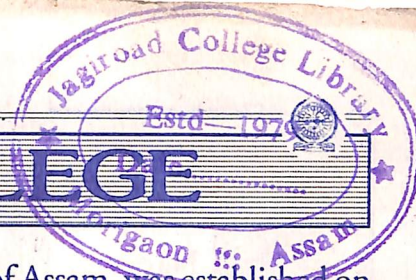

JAGIROAD COLLEGE



Jagiroad College, affiliated to the Gauhati University of Assam, was established on 8th August, 1979, in a picturesque locale beside the Sonaikuchi hills at Jagiroad- barely one hundred metres away from the NH 37 at a distance of 56 kilometres from Guwahati-the state capital. Since then, Jagiroad College has been able to carve a niche for itself in the realm of Higher Education of the state. Sri Mahendra Ahom-the Founder Principal played a pivotal and multiple role-coordinating land allotment, building construction, campaigning to enroll students, communicating with various departments and spreading enthusiasm among the teachers and students alike. He was actively assisted by host of social workers like Sri Nandalal Upadhyaya, Late Harendra Nath Deka, Sri Munin Borthakur, Late Prabin Kr. Borthakur, Sri Jiban Das, Sri Muhini Sarma, Sri Sudhir Kr. Borthakur, Sri Prasad Ch. Dalai, Late Bali Ram Das and others. Local commercial organisations and PSUs like the Jagiroad Dry Fish Merchant's Association and Sitajakhala Dugdha Utpadak Samabay Samiti, the Assam Spun Silk Mills Ltd., the Nagaon Paper Mill - a unit of Hindustan Paper Corporation Ltd. etc. and donors like the Agarwalla brothers of Jagiroad played a key role in laying the foundation of core infrastructural facilities of the college. Fund raising were also done through organizing mobile theatre shows, 'music nite' etc. in the early years. Even the Morigaon District Primary Teacher's Unit contributed their bit by donating an entire month's salary. The Arts stream of the college was brought under the 'grant-in-aid' system of the Assam Government-the Arts stream in 1986 and the same year the Science stream was started. The highly successful organisation of the North East India History Association (NEIHA) conference in 1987 brought the college in academic limelight. Both the Seminar Forum and the College Teachers' Unit came up the same year as well. A host of young and bright aspirants for teachers across the state were also appointed by the College Governing Body during Sri Ahom's tenure. Regular classes, good results, inculcation of liberal human and scientific ethos, stress on co curricular activities, a genial sense of humour and encouragements to hard workers-were the hall marks of Mahendra Ahom's distinctive administrative and managerial skills. In 1992 the college came to national limelight as Ms. Moloya Goswami- one of the faculty members bagged the Best Actress Award in the

National Film Awards for her stellar role in Jahnu Barua directed movie 'Firingoti' ('The Spark'). On 2 January, 1994, Dr. Subhash Saha- one of the faculty members and upcoming historian actively engaged in his Post Doctoral Research and an active 'social artist' of the state died in a tragic accident. The Science stream of the college was accorded 'deficit grant-in-aid' status in 1996. Major course programmes in B.A. and B.Sc. in all subjects offered by the college were opened and the college was brought under the UGC umbrella of 12(f) and 2(b) provisos for receiving aids by the time Sri Ahom passed the baton to Utpalmoni Phukan on 17 January, 1997. Sri Phukan held the reins as the Principal-in-Charge till 26 July, 2000. The Gauhati University inter-college football competition was successfully organised and seminars were organised during Sri Phukan's tenure. Dr. Altafur Rahman joined as the Principal on 27 July, 2000 and under his stewardship the college grew further in terms of infrastructural facilities and a number of new programmes and courses were started. A new multi-storied Girl's Hostel, Boys' Hostel, Full fledged computer centre, extension of library building, canteen, auditorium, community service hall, gymnasium etc. came up during Dr. Rahman's tenure. Between 2000 and 2002 three girls topped the undergraduate Major Programme examinations in Physics, Zoology and Geography among all the affiliated colleges of the Gauhati University. The 22nd Biennial Conference of the North East India Geographical Society (NEIGS) was held on 27 and 28 April, 2002. On 5th October, 2002, the first UGC sponsored State Level Seminar on 'Impact of Human Activities on Environment' was also held. Courses on Tourism and Travel Management (TTM), Computer Application were started at the undergraduate level. During July-August, 2004, a large part of Assam especially the Morigaon district was ravaged by floods. The entire college community came forward in flood relief activities as camps were set inside the college premises. In November, 2004, the college received its first accreditation status from the NAAC following Peer Team inspection on 5th and 6th September. In July, 2005, the college started a full-fledged four-semester Masters Degree Programme in Travel and tourism Management (MTM) and Post Graduate Diploma in Computer Application (PGDCA) as the Academic Council of the Gauhati University approved the syllabi for both the programme. Silver Jubilee Celebrations held during 3-5 October, 2005, was packed with diverse and colourful programme like Exhibition, Seminar, Cultural Programmes, Games and Sporting events, Alumni meet, Open Session etc. The college took a major step in including entrepreneurship skills of students and local youth as it launched a collaborative NBIRT-STED programme in August 2005 benefiting more than 250 trainees so far. Undergraduate course in Biotechnology was launched in July, 2008 as students of programmes like MTM and PGDCA produced excellent results by occupying top positions. Under IGNOU-HE institutions convergence programme a study centre was established which at present offers 26 Programmes and courses. A fair section of the teaching staff completed and earned their research degrees and projects and a number of them continued their research studies in various subjects. Quite a few NCC cadets brought and several students bagged coveted prize in the Gauhati University Youth Festival and prestigious cultural scholarships. A large contingent of students and teachers actively participated in the Katha Asia International Utsav held during January, 2006, in New Delhi. Quite a few members of the alumni earned and established reputation in various professions across the state and the nation. A few of them have been able to carve a niche for themselves abroad as well. On 31st December, 2008, Altafur Rahman superannuated and Sri Utpalmoni Phukan, the Vice-Principal of the college, took over Principal's charge again. In August last year, the Department of Tourism and Travel Management in collaboration with Assam Sahitya Sabha, Jagiroad Branch, successfully organized a UGC sponsored National Seminar on 'Reforming and Revamping the Tourism Sector in the North-Eastern Region of India'. With thirteen hundred odd learners belonging mostly to socio-economically disadvantaged communities, fifty odd experienced teachers, a well developed infrastructure, a functional internal quality assurance mechanism Jagiroad College is now primed for its next big leap-working out a Vision Document and work with commitment towards its execution involving all its stakeholders.

Admission Procedure

Students can apply for admission into College in prescribed admission form with their own handwriting issued by the college office on payment of Rs. 100/- and Rs. 50/- (for Renewal Admission). Admission into the College is strictly on the basis of merit and governed by College Admission rules. Provisions for reservation for SC/ST/OBC applicants is followed as per MHRD and UGC regulations. Priority for excellent performance in cocurricular activities is also accorded. The college has its own provision for poor but meriterious students seeking admission. The decision of the College authority would be the final in this regard. For any wrong or misleading information given in the form, the admission will be liable to be cancelled.

Students those who seek admission are required to produce the following documents at the time of interview and counselling.

- a) Original copies of marksheets and certificates of previous qualifying examinations
- b) Transfer certificate and character certificate from the Head of the Institution last attended
- c) Age Certificate.
- d) Registration and Migration Certificate (wherever applicable)

Students who have discontinued their studies after passing the qualifying examination will have to produce a "Gap Certificate" issued by the Head of the Institution last attended. The certificate has to mention the activities of the student during the period of gap. Students will have to enclose attested photo copies of all the certificates, marksheets as mentioned in clause (a) along with the application form.

- e) Students detained at the Test and Examination of H.S. and T.D.C. classes may be readmitted to the respective classes as regular students subject to the approval of the Principal and Admission Committee.
- f) Unsuccessful candidates of H.S. (Sc) 1st Yr. class will not be readmitted in H.S. 1st Yr. (Sc) class. However, they can take fresh admission in H.S. 1st Yr. (Arts) class.
- g) Unsuccessful candidates of H.S. and T.D.C. final examination shall have to get their names enrolled as 'Casual' students. They must appear in the test examination of the next year.

Submission of Migration Certificate

Candidates who have passed thier last examination from a board or university other then SEBA, AHSHC or G.U. will be required to submit their migration certificate in original latest by 1st October, 2007. Failing to do so may result in admission being cancelled without any notice to them. Migration is usually allowed from Jagiroad College only from 2nd or 3rd year of undergoing a programme.

Academic Session

The Academic Session for the year begins from the month of May. The programme of the major events of the college during the session is outlined in the academic calendar of the college.



College Uniform

Boys : Cream Coloured Shirt and Steel Grey Pant.

Girls : Cream Coloured Mekheia Chadar with grey border or Cream coloured both Churidaar and Kurta and grey Churni/Odhni.

Attendance

It is obligatory to attend classes regularly and punctually. Willful absence from the classroom lectures will be treated as a serious breach of the college discipline. As per Govt. Rule each student is required to attend in each subject a minimum of 75% of the total lectures delivered in the academic session, failing which he / she shall be debarred from appearing in the Final Examination.

Attendance of students will be checked monthly by all departmental Heads and the names of the students having poor attendance will be struck out from the Register. Penalty for lower percentage fixed by the college authority may be charged from students.

Evaluation and Assessment

All students must sit for unit tests, terminals, test examinations and finish their assignments, projects and field reports within the stipulated period. Marks awarded in these tests form a part of the internal assessment at the end of the academic year and are forwarded to the university before the final examination.

Scholarship and Awards

- ➔ ST/SC and OBC and National Merit scholarship for such category of students are offered by the Govt. of Assam on submission of application in prescribed forms.
- ➔ Awards are offered to meritorious students topping the H.S. Sc/Arts TDC Sc./Arts students, from the college authority and Jagiroad College Teachers Unit.
- ➔ Best Graduate Award is awarded to the student judged best for all round activities and performance in the examination.
- ➔ Meritorious economically weaker student are supported by finance, books otherwise. Arrangement for scholarship (both Government and Non-government organisation) will be made by the college authority. Study loans for needy students will also be arranged.

GENERAL RULES FOR MAINTENANCE OF DISCIPLINE IN THE COLLEGE

- i) Great emphasis is laid on discipline and character building and students are required to maintain a high standard of discipline and around the college campus.
- (ii) College uniform is a must in the classroom and in the college premises. Students are expected to present themselves with good postures and gestures.
- (iii) Students admitted to the college must abide by all rules and regulations as prescribed by the college authority. Violation of rules, unsatisfactory progress, irregular attendance, irregular payment of college and hostel fees, showing discourtesy to the teachers and staff members in any form, adoption of unfair means during examination etc. are some of the offences which will invite stringent action.
- (iv) Student's societies and association shall be subjected to such guidance and control as the college administration may prescribe from time to time.
- (v) All powers for maintenance of discipline are vested with the college authority and the decision shall be final and binding in all such matters. Ragging is banned and punishable according to ordinances and laws. In this regard it is pertinent to note that the Supreme Court verdict of 2008 and the subsequent notification by the MHRD would act as the guideline.
- (vi) Students must carry their Identity Cards with them everyday.
- (vii) Students must duly fill up Examination Form at the end of each academic programme.

GRIEVANCE REDRESSAL MECHANISM : A NOTE

Jagiroad College has assiduously developed a fair and transparent grievance redressal mechanism. A Grievance Redressal Cell has been carved out to receive, scrutiny and redressal of all genuine complaints and grievances of its internal stakeholders. The GRC has successfully and competently carried out several rounds of processing feedbacks of students through comprehensively designed formats.



INFRASTRUCTURE AND FACILITIES A GLIMPSE

Classroom Blocks and Buildings :

Jagiroad College offers adequate and updated infrastructure for all internal stakeholders. The college houses two beautiful classroom blocks for students of Arts stream. They are suitably christened as the Kalang and Kapili Blocks after the two perennially flowing tributaries of the Brahmaputra. The Kiling Block houses the distinctively update laboratories, class-room and departmental common rooms of teachers of the science stream. The Mayang Block houses the IGNOU study Centre and the Girls' Common Room. Dr. Subhas Saha Memorial Block houses the departmental common rooms of teachers of the Arts stream and a cosy Guest House of the college.

The Central Library :

The three storied Central Library houses a spacious reading hall and reading rooms for teachers and Major Course students. It has a rich collection of 18 thousand volumes of books, journals and magazines, CDs etc. Computerisation of its services are well under way. The expansion of the library has provided ample space for upgradation and modernisation.

Computer Centre :

The college has a sophisticated air-conditioned Computer Centre with 30 computers for running the PGDCA, Degree level vocational courses, H.S. students and other short term programmes during vacations. A rapid expansion under the Buniyad scheme of government of Assam has augmented further modernisation of the Computer Centre with a provision of 50 more computers.

Cultural Museum :

A unique cultural museum has been developed by the teachers of the college and it is located in the expanded section of the Central Library. Recently a new museum building is to be constructed in front of the central library .

Departmental Libraries :

Every department of study of the college has a separate library of their own. Books are issued to both teachers and students specially of Major Courses and reference books.



Conference Room :

The Conference-cum-seminar room of the college is an active centre for holding brainstorming sessions among the staff and the students.

Auditorium :

A sprawling 8000 sq. ft. auditorium has come up for smooth of organisation of events and activities throughout the session.

Hostels :

The Swapna Mojika triple storied Grils' Hostel with an intake capacity of 80 offers excellent facilities of cosy and comfortable stay. The Zoon Beel R.C.C. Boys' Hostel with an intake capacity of 50 students also provides a conducive environment for academic pursuits of its inmates.

Gymnasium :

The college has a sixteen station multi gymnasium near the college auditorium. It also houses the yoga centre of the college.

Canteen :

The college authority has set up a good canteen that offers its services to the students and staff of the college.

Non Resident Students' Centre :

A non resident students' centre has already come up along with the auditorium. It caters to the diverse recreational need of non resident students like two T.T. boards, chess etc.

Community Hall :

A sprawling Community Hall has come up inside the premises with active collaboration and assistance from the H.D.F.C. and R.G.V.N. It is equipped with traditional handlooms for the use of girl students.

Parking Sheds :

The college has covered bi-cycle and scooter stands for students and the staff. A separate four-wheeler parking lot has also been carved out.

Open Air Sitting Places :

The college offers a cosy and serene open air tree covered sitting space for students inside its premises. A lush green lawn is also being prepared for holding open air sessions. The Annual Debate among the contestants of JCSU office bearers is an attractive event-traditional held every year in the grass carpeted lawn.

CULTURAL SOCIETY

The cultural society of the college has a distinguishing record of being the cradle of producing budding artists and have brought laurels to the institute by winning most of the prestigious events of in the Annual Inter College Youth Festival held in Gauhati for consecutive years. Several members of the cultural society have been working in plays, TV serials and films of acclaim. The staff acts as guides in students's cultural activities. Last year a group of students bagged the Second Best prize for Tolk claucer by participating in the National youth Festival representing the Gawhati University team.

LITERARY AND DEBATING SOCIETY

The Literary and Debating Society of the college is a vibrant society and offers ample scope for facilitating and devolping budding talents.

DEPARTMENTAL SOCIETIES

The Geographical Society of the college is an active organ for popularizing geographical sciences and is regularly holding seminars, model competition, quiz guest lectures, film shows on environment etc. It successfully hosted the Bi-ennial NEIGS conference in the college. Several other departmental societies have been established to explore, develop and shape the diverse interests of the young minds. The Jagiroad branch of the Assam Science Society has impressed people with its activites.
